

Lockout/Tagout (NFPA 70E 2012)

Credit Hours 4 hours

Course Description This course covers the basics of lockout/tagout as well as the procedures outlined in the 2012 edition of NFPA70E: Standard for Electrical Safety in the Workplace. The importance of lockout/tagout is stressed along with definitions and different procedures. Work through five different scenarios using a step by step procedure that either falls under simple lockout/tagout or complex lockout/tagout.

Course Objectives

1. Learners will understand the importance of lockout/tagout.
2. Learners will know when to use lockout/tagout procedures.
3. Learners will know the differences between a usable and non-usable lock and tag.
4. Learners will know which lockout/tagout procedure to use for different situations.
5. Learners will be able to perform a step by step individual employee control job task.
6. Learners will be able to perform a step by step simple lockout/tagout procedure.
7. Learners will be able to perform a step by step complex lockout/tagout procedure.

Method of Presentation This course consists of activity modules along with multiple choice questions. The multiple choice questions are based on what is learned in the activity modules. After the course is successfully completed, the user must affirm they are the one who completed the course and verify that their registration information is correct. A user will not be able to complete the course until the test questions have been passed. The course will also be timed, and users will not be able to get credit until they have spent at least 200 minutes in the course.

Method of Evaluation The licensee must complete all 50 multiple choice questions with a score of at least 75% in order to get credit for the course. Credit will not be awarded unless the licensee has completely answered all questions and the passing grade has been met.
