

4 “Softer Side of Safety.” John Hymel

Companies tend to focus a considerable amount of attention on metrics related to regulatory safety compliance and associated cost and injury/illness data and tracking. Mr. Hymel presentation will offer a perspective on injury/illness prevention through a more emotionally approach toward safety culture and employee development, with emphasis on employee respect, dignity and moral. Mr. Hymel believes that if employers connected with their employees on a more emotional level and approached safety from a more emotional perspective by applying three key principals—dignity, respect and appreciation— they have a far greater potential to realize a safer and more productive workforce. Working to get employees from a “have to” mentality to a “want to” mentality can result in a profound change in attitude, thus leading to a significant change in behavior. Mr. Hymel is a staunch believer that building the “man” is a moral imperative and critical to building a successful safety program and business.

5 “Zero Fatalities,” UDOT

Join in a conversation about making Utah roads safer and learn how you can make a difference. We will be discussing five different Behaviors: Impaired Driving, Distracted Driving such as texting, eating, talking, and etc. Aggressive Driving, driving when you are in a bad mood! 
