MOTION was made by Member Boggess and seconded by Member Earl that the Board direct staff to work with Representative Lisonbee to add language into HB 182 to ensure LEAs provide a translation of all surveys into the language of preference for parents who have made that request.

SUBSTITUTE MOTION was made by Member Davis and seconded by Member Strate that the Board:

1. supports Sen Fillmore's SB 93; and
2. requests that staff work with Sen. Fillmore to:
 - a. add an ability for the Board to allow an LEA to opt out of up to 10% of the survey questions; and
 - b. add language into SB 93 to ensure LEAs provide a translation of the school climate survey into the language of preference for parents who make that request, when possible.

MOTION TO DIVIDE was made by Member Cline and seconded by Member Boggess that the Board divide items #1 and #2 from the above motion.

The motion carried with Members Davis, Hymas, Lear, Norton, Reale, and Strate opposed and Members Moss, Hart, Earl, Boggess, Boothe, Cline, Green, Kerry, and Wood in favor.
