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18	R277-631-2. Definitions.
19	(1)(a) "Toilet trained" means that a student can;
20	(i) communicate the need to use the bathroom to an adult;
21	(ii) sit down on a toilet;
22	(iii) use the toilet without assistance;
23	(iv) undress and dress as necessary; and
24	(v) tend to personal hygienic needs after toileting.
25	(b) If an accident occurs a "toilet trained" child can independently tend to hygienic
26	needs and change clothes.
27	(2) A student is not "toilet trained" if the student has accidents with sufficient
28	frequency to impact the educational experience of the student or the student's peers, as
29	determined by an LEA.
