The following action was taken by the Landmarks Commission on the above described item at its regular meeting of March 20, 2024:

APPROVED WITH CONDITIONS

On a vote of 6:0, the Landmarks Commission approved the above noted application, with the following conditions:

Conditions of Approval

- 1. Any smoke or fire damage from the fire on the façade of the building should be repaired and cleaned using the gentlest means possible. The applicant should provide a plan for how this is to be done to be approved by staff.
- 2. Proposed addition is stepped back 20 feet beginning with the third story and shall receive Project Plan Approval (PPA) prior to a building permit being issued.

STAFF PRESENTATION

NEIGHBORHOOD AND PUBLIC COMMENT

The Neighborhood District Chair was not present or did not address the Landmarks Commission during the hearing. Neighbors or other interested parties were present or addressed the Landmarks Commission.

CONCERNS RAISED BY PUBLIC

Any comments received prior to completion of the Staff Report are addressed in the Staff Report to the Landmarks Commission. Key issues from public comment during the public hearing included the following:

- There are unresolved parking issues from the previous owner and parking garage.
- There is a trash compactor on property lines in the rear of the building.
- The look of the new additions should be complementary to the existing building.

APPLICANT RESPONSE

Key points addressed in the applicant's presentation to the Landmarks Commission included the following:

• The applicant is on board to preserve the existing façade and will make sure that it is protected.

- The walls should all remain except for the rear wall will have to come down to allow for equipment in and out as part of the remodel.
- The building on the east is not damaged as much as the other.
- The plan is to make them look more like two separate buildings.

LANDMARKS COMMISSION DISCUSSION

Key points discussed by the Landmarks Commission included the following:

- The buildings will have more of a separate look moving forward by removing the awning and redesigning the lower storefront.
- The new addition would be above the building on the east and not the other building.
- The demolition will only be on the inside.
- New steel structure will be built inside and have its own new foundations.
