






Signage Enforcement

- Awaiting WFRC for the next steps and to solicit the proposals for the plan.









Clearfield High Reimagined

- Mult-year project to reconstruct and remodel Clearfield High School.
- Phase 1 is included in the most recent bond. Future phases will need to be bonded for.
- Phase 1 is the Clearfield High Career Center
 - Automotive technologies
 - Cooking
 - Childcare
 - Etc.
 - This will remove existing on-site parking that will not be replaced until future phases.
