

**WASHINGTON COUNTY COMMISSION
MEETING MINUTES
APRIL 2, 2024**

The Regular Meeting of the Board of the Washington County Commission was called to order by Chairman Gil Almquist at 4:00 p.m. on April 2, 2024, in the Washington County Commission Chambers, and via Zoom 111 East Tabernacle, St. George, Utah. Those in attendance were Commissioner Gil Almquist, Commissioner Victor Iverson, Commissioner Adam Snow, Deputy County Attorney Devin Snow, County Administrator Nicholle Felshaw and Deputy Clerk Sarah Lloyd.

CONSENT AGENDA:

REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS FOR CONSIDERATION:

2023 YEAR IN REVIEW VIDEO:

Commissioner Snow introduced the fifth of twelve 2023 Year in Review videos, which was then shared. This video highlighted Washington County being awarded Best Value for Tax Payers by the Utah Taxpayers Association.

PRESENTATION: MISS WASHINGTON COUNTY AND MISS GREATER ZION INTRODUCTION

Executive Director of Royalty Director Alison Anderson introduced the winners of the Fair Royalty. Miss Washington County Riley Imlay, Miss Greater Zion Kaili Ruth, First (1st) Runner Up Brooklyn Kranendonk and Miss Spirit Brooklyn Field introduced themselves.

PRESENTATION: SEMI-ANNUAL VICTIMS OF CRIME ACT REPORT (VOCA)

Children’s Justice Center (CJC) Director Kristy Pike explained that the CJC collaborates with multidisciplinary partners to protect each child, advance justice, promote healing, and educate the community. The Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) grant is one funding source for the CJC. There were 419 primary victims served in 2023.

MOTION: Motion by Commissioner Iverson to Approve the Purchase Requests as Outlined. Motion seconded by Commissioner Snow and carried by unanimous vote, with Commissioners Almquist, Iverson and Snow voting aye.

CONSIDERATION OF ORDINANCE NO. 2024-1253-O, AN ORDINANCE UPDATING SECTIONS OF THE COUNTY CODE REGARDING COUNTY COMMISSION MEETINGS

Deputy County Attorney Devin Snow stated that during the 2024 legislative session, the Utah Legislature adopted House Bill 36 Open and Public Meetings Act Amendments, which makes it necessary to make it clear how a county commission meeting is convened and to clean up relevant sections of the Washington County code and removes redundancies.

MOTION: Motion by Commissioner Snow to Adopt Ordinance No. 2024-1253-O, An Ordinance Updating Sections of the County Code Regarding County Commission Meetings. Motion seconded by Commissioner Iverson and carried by unanimous vote, with Commissioners Almquist, Iverson and Snow voting aye.

CONSIDERATION OF ORDINANCE NO. 2024-1254-O, AN ORDINANCE APPROVING THE DEDICATION FOR THE 175 EAST ROADWAY BY NEW HARMONY IN WASHINGTON COUNTY, UTAH

MOTION: Motion by Commissioner Iverson to Table Ordinance No. 2024-1254-O, An Ordinance Approving the Dedication for the 175 East Roadway by New Harmony in Washington County, Utah.. Motion seconded by Commissioner Snow and carried by unanimous vote, with Commissioners Almquist, Iverson and Snow voting aye.

CONSIDERATION OF ORDINANCE NO. 2024-1255-O, AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A TEMPORARY LAND USE REGULATION (MORATORIUM) ON ZONE CHANGES ONLY IN THE DESIGNATED AREA ON THE ATTACHED MAP GENERALLY DESCRIBED AS THE NEW HARMONY VALLEY AREA AND ONLY IN ITS UNINCORPORATED AREA

Deputy County Attorney Victoria Hales stated this would affect a small portion of Washington County in the New Harmony Valley Area to pause zone changes while the proposed New Harmony Overlay Zone is reviewed. This moratorium will last six months unless terminated earlier.

MOTION: Motion by Commissioner Iverson to Adopt Ordinance No. 2024-1255-O, An Ordinance Establishing a Temporary Land Use Regulation (Moratorium) on Zone Changes Only in the Designated Area on the Attached Map Generally Described as the New Harmony Valley Area and Only in Its Unincorporated Area. Motion seconded by Commissioner Snow and carried by unanimous vote, with Commissioners Almquist, Iverson and Snow voting aye.

CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. R-2024-3281, A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS RECOMMENDATIONS

Public Works Director Todd Edwards stated the Council of Governments (COG) serves as a recommending body to Washington County and oversees the expenditures of local transportation preservation funds. There are four (4) projects being recommended for funding which are:

- The approval of a Hurricane City funding request of \$100,000 from the Preservation Fund for roadway right-of-way acquisition for the 1100 West corridor
- The approval of an Ivins City funding request of \$604,000 from the Preservation Fund for roadway right-of-way acquisition for Old Highway 91, Main Street and the Western Corridor Roundabout
- The de-obligation of funds totaling \$7,877.92 back to the Preservation Fund that was allocated for the Apple Valley SR-9 to SR-59 Smithsonian Butte Corridor
- The de-obligation of funds totaling \$24,444 back to the Construction Grant Fund that was allocated for the Washington County Multi-Use Path on SR-18 between Veyo and Central

MOTION: Motion by Commissioner Snow to Adopt Resolution No. R-2024-3281, A Resolution Approving the Council of Governments Recommendations. Motion seconded by Commissioner Iverson and carried by unanimous vote, with Commissioners Almquist, Iverson and Snow voting aye.

CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. R-2024-3282, A RESOLUTION PROVIDING COMMENT ON ZION NATIONAL PARK'S SOUTH ENTRANCE RE-DESIGN PROJECT

Regional Tourism Regulatory Affairs Director Heath Hansen explained Zion National Park invited Washington County to participate in the public comment process for the proposed Zion Canyon South Entrance Redesign Project.

MOTION: Motion by Commissioner Iverson to Adopt Resolution No. R-2024-3282, A Resolution Providing Comment on Zion National Park's South Entrance Re-Design Project. Motion seconded by Commissioner Snow and carried by unanimous vote, with Commissioners Almquist, Iverson and Snow voting aye.

CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. R-2024-3283, A RESOLUTION APPROVING A FINANCIAL OBLIGATION AGREEMENT FOR GRAZING FENCING AT THE CONFLUENCE PARK

Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP) Executive Assistant and Grant Manager Randee Sanders stated there is an agreement with Casey Lofthouse to farm the fields in Confluence Park. In order to do grazing, the fencing needs to be reassessed. Mr. Lofthouse received a grant through the Utah Department of Agriculture and Food for \$10,000, which cover a portion of the fencing needing repair. Leon Gubler commented on reports of the north pasture being over irrigated, which he stated was not the case, but is caused by overflow from the Washington County Water Conservancy District.

MOTION: Motion by Commissioner Iverson to Adopt Resolution No. R-2024-3283, A Resolution Approving a Financial Obligation Agreement for Grazing Fencing at the Confluence Park. Motion seconded by Commissioner Snow and carried by unanimous vote, with Commissioners Almquist, Iverson and Snow voting aye.

CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. R-2024-3284, A RESOLUTION APPROVING TRT FUNDING FOR MARKETING SPONSORSHIPS AND EVENT FUNDING FOR NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS IN WASHINGTON COUNTY

Greater Zion Tourism Operations Manager Jamie Allen explained that TRT funding can also be used for marketing and event funding of various events to be held in Washington County. The following non-profit organizations were recommended to receive marketing sponsorship funding as follows:

MOTION: Motion by Commissioner Snow to Adopt Resolution No. R-2024-3284, A Resolution Approving TRT Funding for Marketing Sponsorships and Event Funding for Non-Profit Organizations in Washington County. Motion seconded by Commissioner Iverson and carried by unanimous vote, with Commissioners Almquist, Iverson and Snow voting aye.

CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. R-2024-3285, A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT TO PARTIALLY FUND THE REMODEL OF THE COX AUDITORIUM WITH TRCC FUNDING AS RECOMMENDED AND BUDGETED BY TAB

Brad Last, Vice President of University Advancement stated this request is for partial funding to completely renovate the Cox Auditorium with funding allocated through Tourism, Recreation, Cultural, Convention and Airport Facilities Tax (TRCC).

MOTION: Motion by Commissioner Snow to Adopt Resolution No. R-2024-3285, A Resolution and Interlocal Agreement to Partially Fund the Remodel of the Cox Auditorium with TRCC Funding as Recommended and Budgeted by TAB. Motion seconded by Commissioner Iverson and carried by unanimous vote, with Commissioners Almquist, Iverson and Snow voting aye.

CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. R-2024-3286, A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE RENEWAL OF AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN WASHINGTON COUNTY AND GRANICUS FOR SHORT-TERM RENTAL ADDRESS IDENTIFICATION AND COMPLIANCE MONITORING

Greater Zion Tourism Director Brittany McMichael explained this is the second year working with Granicus to monitor the short-term rental industry in Washington County. It is recommended to renew this contract for one year, through February 20, 2025.

MOTION: Motion by Commissioner Snow to Adopt Resolution No. R-2024-3286, A Resolution Approving the Renewal of an Agreement Between Washington County and Granicus for Short-Term Rental Address Identification and Compliance Monitoring. Motion seconded by Commissioner Iverson and carried by unanimous vote, with Commissioners Almquist, Iverson and Snow voting aye.

CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. R-2024-3287, A RESOLUTION APPROVING A STIPULATED SETTLEMENT IN THE MATTER OF INTERMOUNTAIN POWER AGENCY VS. PROPERTY TAX DIVISION OF THE UTAH STATE TAX COMMISSION

Deputy County Attorney Devin Snow stated this is a settlement of a tax appeal case that has been pending for many years. This case relates to some centrally assessed property owned by the Intermountain Power Agency. Washington County is minimally involved, with an estimated result of approximately \$55,000 being refunded to the Intermountain Power Agency.

MOTION: Motion by Commissioner Iverson to Adopt Resolution No. R-2024-3287, A Resolution Approving a Stipulated Settlement in the Matter of Intermountain Power Agency Vs. Property Tax Division of the Utah State Tax Commission. Motion seconded by Commissioner Snow and carried by unanimous vote, with Commissioners Almquist, Iverson and Snow voting aye.

CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. R-2024-3288, A RESOLUTION APPROVING A REQUEST FOR GRANT FUNDING UNDER THE DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER PROGRAM

County Administrator Nicholle Felshaw explained there is the need to construct a building to house Emergency Operations. There is a grant available through the Department of Homeland Security Emergency Operations Center Program. It is requested that the County apply for this grant.


MOTION: Motion by Commissioner Iverson to Adopt Resolution No. R-2024-3288, A Resolution Approving a Request for Grant Funding Under the Department of Homeland Security Emergency Operations Center Program. Motion seconded by Commissioner Snow and carried by unanimous vote, with Commissioners Almquist, Iverson and Snow voting aye.

CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTION NO. R-2024-3289, A RESOLUTION APPROVING A PROPOSAL FROM LANDMARK TESTING & ENGINEERING FOR INSPECTIONS AT THE BOULEVARD BUILDING REMODEL


Ms. Felshaw stated that Landmark Testing & Engineering has prepared a proposal for professional services at the Boulevard Building remodel.

Sarah has an extensive musical background. She has placed in three international piano competitions, one of which led to the opportunity to perform as a soloist at Carnegie Hall. As a concert pianist, she has soloed with the Utah Symphony and with several professional ensembles across the U.S. and China.
