Work Session:

To discuss - PROPOSED REVISIONS TO THE WILLARD CITY GENERAL PLAN.

Mayor Braegger opened the meeting and turned the time over to City Planner Bryce Wheelwright to open the item. Bryce presented the attached proposed revision to the Willard City General Plan. He explained the Planning Commission wanted the work session with the City Council to make sure they were heading in a direction the City Council is on board with before they continue. He presented the Willard City Current Zoning Map and the Land Use Map. He explained the Land Use Map is a plan for future zoning. Bryce then presented the Building Constraints Map showing sensitive building areas and the Master Road Plan. He asked if there were any questions regarding the map or the General Plan before they begin reviewing the document.

Council member Fredde stated he felt it would be important to include the South Willard Special Service District into the General Plan. He explained it is the District formed by 3 property owners in South Willard to upsize some of the sewer lines in anticipation of development and they will likely have some major impact in the future.

Bryce then reviewed the Residential and Transportation portions of the General Plan and asked if

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there were any questions. Council member Fredde stated he felt there was not anything addressing high density residential development and stated he there is a potential developer desirous of that and feels there should be something in the Plan that states it does not meet our rural atmosphere or something that addresses it. Planning Commissioner Meyers stated she felt it was addressed in the Planned Development Ordinance 10,000 square ft. lot portion. They also brought up the Transit Oriented District Ordinance.

Bryce then moved on to the Parks and Recreation portion. Discussion was held on encouraging xeriscape and low maintenance facilities as well as having schools in the community bringing in soccer fields, baseball fields and other facilities. Mayor Braegger stated he met with the School Superintendent who indicated they are really interested in a school location on the North end of Willard. The property designated in the current approve Planned Development is too close to the railroad track. A new school will probably not be planned for the area until 10-20 years from now. On section 12-011 of the Parks and Recreation portion, item (e) they discussed removing the final sentence.

5:45 p.m. Ryan Tingey arrived at the meeting and passed out the attached packet titled Deer Run Preserve to each of the City Council members and Planning Commission members. He stated he would be back in touch.

The work session resumed. Bryce then presented a series of maps, developed by the Bear River Association of Governments, showing different zoning scenarios of projected build out. The work session was then adjourned at 6:00 p.m.

6:05 p.m. Mayor Braegger opened the regular City Council meeting.

He stated he spoke with John Cook of the DWQ and revised the current monthly payment of \$59.50 per ERU and also updated the ERU's to the current number of 671.5. The meeting where they will discuss the possibility of the refinancing of the bonds is March 25th and the Mayor will attend. Council member Fredde said he could attend also.

4. Department Reports

a. Maintenance Department

1) Progress report 100 N Waterline Project – Council member Beebe gave a progress report on the project. He stated they are about to 200 E from 100 E. Public Works Supervisor Doug Thompson stated he would like there to be something put in place where they do not allow utilities to bore and install lines. He stated Century link installed a fiber optic line and the location varies drastically depending on the type of soil. The fiber optic line is 2 ft deep in some places and up to 5 ft in others and does not run in a straight line. It has slowed the contractor down significantly and Doug said he would not be surprised if the contractor does not submit and add to the project for the extra labor. They also discussed about possibly putting an ordinance in place to require the utility to move their line at the City's request.

The 200 West Trail Project was then discussed. Council member Beebe stated the county pulled off of the job because of other projects they needed to complete. He stated they will come back and grade after we have material hauled in. Council member Beebe stated he is also looking at bids for paving the trail. He also requested a letter be written to the County Commission thanking the Road Department for their help.
