Raymond Christy with the Utah Transit Authority:

UTA has a committee (CAT) to ensure UTA provides better than average services for people with disabilities. The committee is made of volunteers who serve for 3 years. They advise UTA on how to serve people with disabilities. The Committee is looking for people to join the committee. The committee includes subcommittees on Planning, Services, and Public Relations.

Brad Mepham with People Builders

Former Utah Jazz player established a foundation that has provided wheelchair kits for people in Utah. People Builders' vision is to equip men and women in a second chance carpenter shop.

The group recently built a modular kit that can be shipped anywhere in the United States with a proposed two week lead-time. People Builders is working to establish relationships with agencies and introduce philanthropy too.

Paul Smith with System of Care Update

The pilot program will start in the Western Region (Utah County). There will be approximately 20 youth. The youth will receive a system of care support coordinator who is responsible for a holistic approach to

accessing multiple agencies at DHS. DSPD will pick approximately 5 kids to receive this wrap around services to pilot.

The purpose is to keep kids in their homes and out of restrictive settings. Coordinators are hired out of the Executive Director's Office.

Paul Smith on Service Rates

The Division is applying the appropriations to service rates where there is a traditional direct care. The Division is investing research on how to accomplish this task. This will also applies to SAS families.

We want to change the rate by April 1st, so we need to get billings back in as soon as possible

The Division will consider how families will interpret this change.
