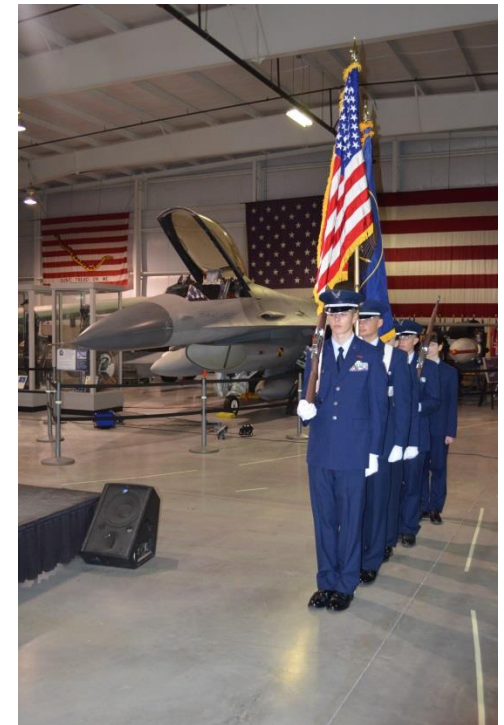

Comparative Score Analysis of 2014 – 2015
with Projections

NWEA Exams November/March

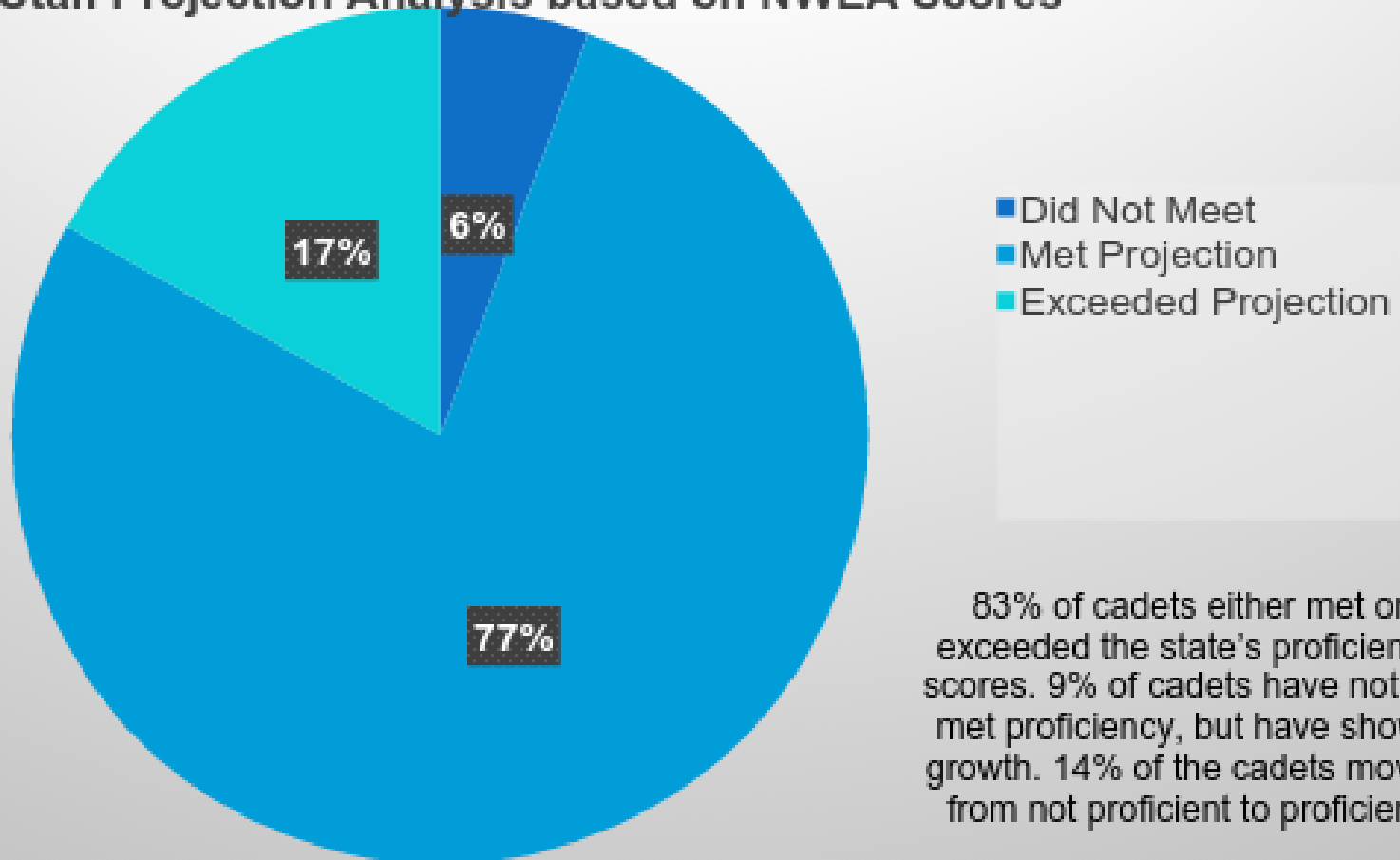
- Administered full exams to all cadets November of 2014
- Employed data to differentiate instruction /added classes/smaller class sizes
- Administered survey exams to a random sample of all cadets March 2015
- Comparatively cadets saw gains from the new instruction model beginning January 2015

Advantages to Timely Adaptive Testing

- NWEA provides cadets with challenging adaptive questioning for individual cadets
- Three columnar presentation (see reports) allows for specific skill drill down
- Reports and scores are available 24 hours after tests are administered – not months
- All cadets can set goals based on RIT scores for each test

Moving Forward – Spring NWEA

- Spring NWEA will be administered the last two weeks of May
- Scores will be compared to State SAGE scores when they are available
- Survey tests are administered to all incoming cadets to determine placement for courses
- Teacher training on the use of Drill Down Reports for individual cadets will continue into the summer
