**NO ACTION COMMENTS**

1. **SCHEDULING.** The Deputy City Recorder informed those at the meeting of upcoming events, meetings, activities, etc.

2. **CITIZEN COMMENTS/QUESTIONS.** None.
3. **MAYOR COMMENTS.** Mayor Wood updated the Council on the 2016 budget gap. Staff updates this every quarter. The last hold harmless distribution the City received from the State was in June for \$1.5 million dollars. The highest it has ever been was \$3.6 million since they have been tracking it in 2010-2011. The City is still currently growing at a nine percent rate. A plan is in place if the City has a shortfall, which can be provided to the Council. If the growth rate were to slow at any point in time, down to six percent or less, the gap would be closed by a sales tax bond retirement, three grant funded Police Department positions that have not been in place for three years due to the J.A.G. Grant restructure, the ambulance shortfall improvement that was approved by the legislation this year, and utilizing the growth in the City Option Tax. The City will receive one more hold harmless payment from the State in June 2016 which should be around \$600,000.

The City hosted United Way groups from North Carolina, South Carolina, Texas, Maryland and Idaho this afternoon. They toured Promise South Salt Lake facilities at City Hall, Woodrow Wilson Elementary and Granite Park Junior High.

4. **CITY ATTORNEY COMMENTS.** None.
5. **CITY COUNCIL COMMENTS.** Council Member Rutter expressed his condolences to the families of those involved in the recent tragedies in the City. They don't happen often like they used to when he was first on the Council. Things are happening in the City in a positive way. It's a good thing to live in South Salt Lake.

Council Member Rapp thanked Public Works for redoing the handicap access to the sidewalks. They are doing an extremely good job.

Council Member Snow reported on a "Meet the Candidates" night which was a good event where people were able to meet those who are running for Council seats. She also attended the Open House hosted by the City for the green space bond that is on the ballot. She felt it was super educational and a good opportunity for the citizens to come and learn more. She would like to see better attendance. They are good events and those who come are well served.

6. **INFORMATION. Streetcar Development Update.** Community and Economic Development Director, Mike Florence, provided a presentation update on the Ritz Classic Apartment Homes and the Zellerbach Apartments. A copy of the presentation is attached and incorporated by this reference. The Ritz apartments will be five stories with 287 units. Zellerbach Apartments is a four story project with 292 units. Both projects are one hundred percent rental. Both projects want to compete with Sugarhouse so they're hoping to charge \$1,500 per month. Sugarhouse is a lot higher. Both are quality projects.

**ACTION ITEMS****NEW COUNCIL BUSINESS**

- 1. A resolution requesting the recertification of the South Salt Lake Justice Court.** Deputy City Attorney, Hannah Vickery, explained that the law requires the court to recertify every four years and South Salt Lake's recertification is due in February. This resolution needs to be given to the A.O.C. by October 30, 2015 in order to meet the legal requirement.

Ms. Vickery feels the justice court is important because of efficiency. They resolve a lot of cases and resolve them quicker. Without the justice courts the District Court would be overwhelmed. Relationship building is also important. At the justice court the prosecutor appears in front of the same judge every day and deals with the same staff and police department every day. That inner working adds to the efficiency of the court process.

Deputy Police Chief, Dwayne Ruth, agreed with Ms. Vickery regarding the efficiency of the court. The Police Department has developed a great relationship with the court personnel.


