- 1. SCHEDULING. The Deputy City Recorder informed those at the meeting of upcoming events, meetings, activities, etc.
- 2. CITIZEN COMMENTS/QUESTIONS. None.
- 3. MAYOR COMMENTS. Mayor Wood thanked Jennifer Allred for the hard work and commitment she gives to the Youth City Council. She also thanked the public safety of South Salt Lake for their hard work and dedication to the residents and businesses.

- 5. CITY COUNCIL COMMENTS. Council Member Beverly said she is impressed with the Youth City Council.

6. INFORMATION – Victim Advocate Report – VOCA and VAWA Grant Update. Victim Advocate, Brooke St. John, told of an elderly woman in the community who offered to let a homeless man move in and gave him a lot of money to fix her carport. He brought a domestic problem with him that she has been exposed to and now the carport is ready to collapse. Urban Livability has stepped in to help her get funding to fix the carport and a restraining order is in place for the homeless man.

Mayor Wood said her cabinet went there for their cabinet meeting and did some service on her home and helped her get back on her feet.

PUBLIC HEARING - 7:00 p.m. (Or as soon thereafter as possible)

Public hearing to hear arguments in favor and against the City's proposed ballot proposition to authorize the City to issue general obligation bonds in a principal amount not to exceed \$13,000,000 for the purpose of acquiring, improving or extending parks, open space, trails and recreation facilities and related facilities. City Attorney, Lyn Creswell, gave a handout to the Council of the "for" and "against" statements and their rebuttals. He explained it is the same information that was provided in the voter information packets. A copy is attached and incorporated by this reference.

The public hearing was opened at 7:31 p.m.

Leslie Jones, 235 West 3680 South. She thanked the Council for putting this issue on the ballot to allow the citizens to make the decision. She believes passing the ballot will allow the City to be in a position financially to take advantages of those opportunities that will come along in the future. It is also in line with the Master Plan of the City.

The public hearing was closed at 7:32 p.m.

1. A resolution granting permission for the Police Department to appropriate certain property in its possession to public interest use. Deputy City Attorney, Hannah Vickery, explained that this resolution is to appropriate fire arms that have been held in evidence in the Police Department. They have passed the timeline that they are to be held.

Council Member Snow asked what Shooter's World does with the weapons.

Ms. Vickery believes they can sell them or destroy them.

Council Member Gold asked if the history of the gun (where it was acquired, the crime that was committed with it, etc.) is given to the buyer.

Ms. Vickery said it is not. Some of the firearms are destroyed.

Council Member Snow noted that a lot of them don't have serial numbers and wondered why.

Ms. Vickery said she is not sure.
