# Delta South Elementary School Teacher Request for Prep Time

DSES Elementary Teachers Request for Prep Time

The Preschool and Kindergarten elementary teachers from the Delta South Elementary School requested to meet with the Members of the Board to review and discuss the start time and end time, preparation time, and the need for instructional assistant help.

There was concern expressed that students are being dropped off at school by 7:45 a.m. and that school does not start until 8:30 a,m., with these students being in the classroom and the teachers are unable to prepare for their classes. These same students remain at the school until 3:20 p.m. This situation gives limited planning time. It was suggested that the Kindergarten teachers should have thirty minutes per Kindergarten class for prep time and first grade should have forty-five minutes of prep time.

Because of scheduling concerns, the elementary teachers called and did not come to this meeting.

Superintendent Styler shared with the Members of the Board a proposed schedule that had been discussed with the Principals and the Transportation Supervisor. The Friday "early-out" may be eliminated and each teacher would be given a prep period each day.

These financial statements are the responsibility of District management.

In the opinion of Gilbert and Stewart, the financial statements referred to above fairly, in all material respects, represent the respective financial position of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of Millard School District as of June 30, 2015, and the respective budgetary comparison for the general fund for the year then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

The District is reporting under the financial model of GASB Statement No. 34. In the opinion of Gilbert and Stewart, Millard School District complied, in all material respects, with the general compliance requirements identified above and the requirements governing types of services allowed or unallowed; eligibility; matching; level of effort; or earmarking; reporting; and special tests and provisions that are applicable to each of its major state assistance programs for the year ended June 30, 2015.

The June 30, 2015 financial statements have been reviewed by the State of Utah, Office of the State Auditor, to verify substantial compliance with generally accepted accounting principals (GAAP); Government Auditing Standards; and, where possible, to verify compliance with finance-related legal and contractual provisions as set forth by State law.

- 1. Preston Carter spoke on behalf of some of the Delta High School graduating seniors regarding moving of the Delta High School graduation from the Palladium to the auditorium. He suggested that by moving the graduation to the auditorium, this would limit the number of family members that may be able to attend. He had grown up desiring to graduate in the Palladium. Life is full of memories and who you share this with. Preston Carter presented a petition to the Members of the Board signed by sixty of the graduating seniors requesting that the Delta High School graduation continue to be held in the Palladium.
- 2. Ray Searle spoke on the limiting of those allowed to attend Delta High School graduation that would possibily leave out some family support that are so instrumental in the lives of children.

### **Public Comment**

- 3. Tina Carter indicated that this was an emotional issue for her and that she does not support some of her family not being allowed to attend graduation. She would ask that the Delta High School graduation be continued in the Palladium.
- 4. Michelle Melville spoke on being in favor of changing the Delta High School graduation from the Palladium to the auditorium. She indicated that she felt that graduation was a family affair and not a community affair. Michelle would favor a more formal graduation ceremony.
- 5. Randy Riding indicated that he strongly disagrees with the graduation being moved from the Palladium to the auditorium. This would greatly limit the number of family members who would be able to attend. Randy suggested that this is a community event rather than a family event.
- 6. Amanda Nielson spoke on coming from a broken family and with split families, it would be difficult to have those from family limited to whom may attend. She suggested that the graduation be continued to be held in the Palladium.
- 7. Barry Atkinson expressed that he strongly disagrees with the Delta High School graduation being moved from the Palladium to the auditorium. The desire for all family to attend graduation should be the focus.
- 8. Cindy Chambles spoke in favor of moving forward with the graduation being held in the auditorium and having a more formal graduation. Delta High School's graduation needs to have more dignity. There should not be food allowed and people should be properly dressed.
- 9. Lisa Riding spoke in behalf of having a graduating senior and asked the Board to please follow the desire of the senior class to have graduation in the Palladium, as the petition has asked for. She suggested that the majority of the senior class would like to have the graduation in the Palladium.
- 10. Becky Searle has a grandson who is a senior and she feels she may be limited and not be able to attend the graduation if it is held in the auditorium. Please do not make families pick and choose who may or may not be able to attend graduation.
- 11. Jennifer Henke has a son graduating and is also the Delta High School swim coach. If tickets are limited many of her family would not be able to attend and she would not be able to support those students whom she has coached in swimming. She would like to be able to attend graduations each year.
- 12. Miranda Riding is a graduating senior and would ask that graduation be moved back to the Palladium. She would need thirteen tickets plus tickets to accommodate her family and possibly more for her friends to attend.
- 13. Carl Anderson suggested the limiting of electronic devices in the room and that individuals should be paying attention to the desires of those here for Board meeting. Graduation should not be limited to a few family members being able to attend. He does not know what he would do if tickets were to be limited. His is a broken and blended family and there needs to be more tickets available for his family.
- 14. Lexi Riding does not like the idea of moving graduation to the auditorium and limiting tickets. Please do not limit the tickets.

- 15. Isabella Perkins is concerned that only immediate family members would be allowed to attend. She has many friends and other support people from around the state who would not be able to attend if the tickets were limited.
- 16. Susan Kooyman Graduation is all about family and the support of family. Graduation needs to be a fun time for the seniors and does not need to be that formal. She does not care about the food being brought in and is not offended by such activities. There are formal activities such as the Senior assembly and Senior Awards Assembly that take the place of a formal graduation. Please leave graduation alone and do not move it to the auditorium. This should be up to the Senior class and should be the seniors choice.
