
Staff recommends approval of funding for the installation and mounting pedestal for a bronze sculpture in an amount not to exceed \$40,000.





BACKGROUND DISCUSSION:

City Council has been asked to approve the funding for a bronze sculpture with the theme of West Jordan's heritage. The proposed artist, if selected, would expend the entire \$60,000 for the creation and casting of the bronze sculpture in keeping with the RFP. His fee does not include the installation of the sculpture or the pedestal it will sit upon, which is standard practice with sculpture commissions.

The proposed location for the sculpture is where the existing water feature is located at the entrance to City Hall. Because of the location, there is an opportunity to possibly repurpose the existing water feature to be incorporated into the base of the bronze sculpture which is very appropriate for the sculpture's theme.

This proposed funding would be for the installation and mounting of this sculpture and to pay an additional fee to the artist to determine whether incorporating the existing water feature is feasible or desirable and, if so, to design the new base. The intent is not to use the entire \$40,000, however, an estimate for the work cannot be completed until the artist presents a concept to the City for approval. This would then determine the amount of demolition, remodeling and reconstruction for a base that would be required to support a sculpture of the size and weight proposed.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO APPROVE FUNDING FOR INSTALLATION AND MOUNTING OF A PEDESTAL FOR A BRONZE SCULPTURE
