Hallandale Pharmacy

Jan-14

Hallandale Pharmacy has never been licensed to operate as a Pharmacy or dispense prescription drugs in the State of Utah. Between November 2012 and September 2013, on 26 different occasions in the State of Utah, Hallandale Pharmacy filled prescriptions for the prescription-only drug Sermorelin, for patients located in Utah.

Hallandale Pharmacy filled prescriptions sent to it by a Utah physician. Hallandale Pharmacy sent the filled prescriptions back to the Utah physician who dispensed the prescription medication to each patient.

Hallandale Pharmacy agreed to pay a fine of \$50,000 to the Division. Of that fine, \$40,000 was suspended. The \$10,000 is due by April 8, 2014.

David Monson, Pharmacy Technician

On January 17, 2014, David Monson was found unconscious in a pharmacy bathroom after using Remifentanyl. Mr. Monson did not possess a valid prescription for Dilaudid, Fentanyl, or Remifentanyl, and Mr. Monson was not lawfully administered Dilaudid, Fentanyl, or Remifentanyl between December 2013 and January 2014. Mr. Monson Surrendered his license.

Terry Van Vleet, Pharmacist

July 2, 2012, Mr. Van Vleet was observed driving and unable to maintain a travel lane. He was observed by an Ogden City Police Officer to be very disoriented. Mr. Van Vleet was transported to the hospital, and while there he reported to the ER physician that he only took "asprin"; however, he drug tested positive for opiates, synthetic opiates and benzodiazepines. Mr. Van Vleet admitted that he was not prescribed the opiates or the benzodiazepines.

August 23, 2012, Chief Investigator David Furlong went to Terry Van Vleet's home to interview Mr. Van Vleet. Mr. Van Vleet stated to Chief Investigator David Furlong that on or about May 22, 2012, he was involved in a traffic accident, resulting in a brain injury. Mr. Van Vleet further reported that on July 20, 2012, he was involved in a traffic incident where he became disoriented while driving. He also stated that he was very confused that day and could not remember everything that happened. He also appeared to be very confused while being interviewed by Chief Investigator David Furlong.

Mr. Van Vleet suffers from ongoing mental confusion at times and may be a danger to the public who rely on him to fill prescription narcotics and other medications. Mr. Van Vleet Surrendered his license.
