History of Rabies Control in Davis County

Regulation was originally adopted by the Board of Health in November 2013.

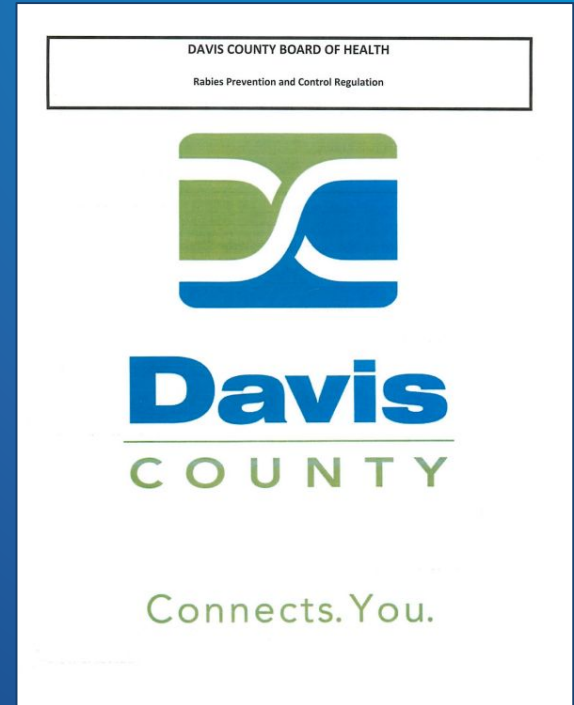
Regulation has provided the following outcomes:

- Removed the need for city approvals;
- Provided a single document where information and guidance can be obtained;
- Facilitated a better collaboration between public health and animal care.

Current Regulation

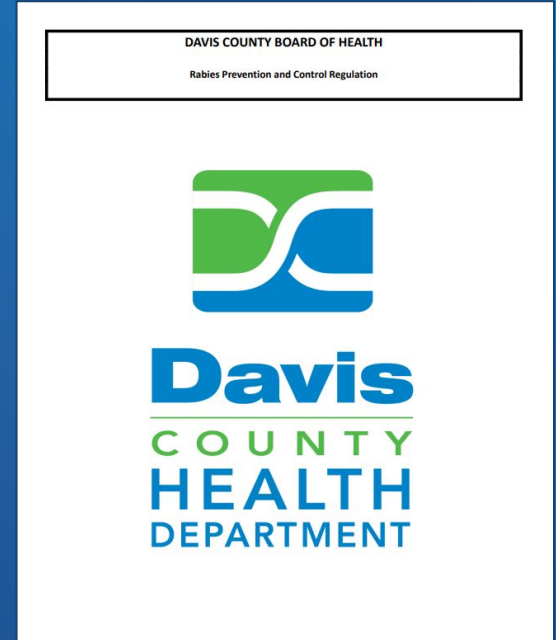
Current regulation was adopted by the Board of Health in November 2018.

- Updates from the *Compendium of Animal Rabies Prevention and Control*:
 - Quarantine length changed from 6 months to 4 months for unvaccinated animals with an exposure.
- Quarantine locations may be determined between the Health Officer and Animal Care.



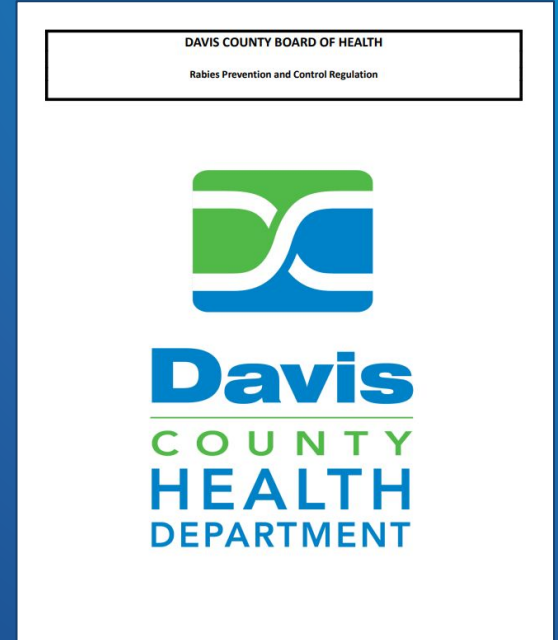
Updates to Regulation

- Added a section regarding *Enforcement Authority*.
- Renamed *Animal Control* to *Animal Care of Davis County*.
- Separated regulations regarding *Animal Care* and *Human Care* into two separate sections (previously had been combined).
- Reworded to have consistency in phrasing quarantine terms, i.e. “*placed in a 4-month quarantine*” as opposed to “*held in*” or “*confined in a strict quarantine.*”



Updates to Regulation

- Defined *custodian*.
- Made overall formatting and grammatical changes.
