5. Recent developments, activities, and concerns – Alli Garrison

John was concerned about e-bikes and motorized vehicles on the Jordan River Parkway that are moving at a dangerous pace on the walkway. There was a brief discussion on issues involved with safety on the parkway.

Suggestions about how to improve the safety on the parkway and park were discussed.

1. Chief Boulden followed up on Alli's concern regarding the construction site where 49th Street Galleria was located. At the present time there is not a safety barrier around perimeter of site. The Fire Department has followed up with an email to building and zoning department regarding placement of a barrier for safety.
2. Chief Boulden briefly shared an update on possible flooding issues in the Murray City area and the preparations made for future concerns.
8. Policy Review

MCPD (310) – Domestic Violence

Chief Obrey briefly explained the procedures and guidelines in a domestic violence issue.

When an individual is booked into jail for a Domestic Violence related offense the jail is required to notify the police department when the individual is released allowing officers to contact the abused individual for their safety.

Andrea asked regarding statistics of domestic violent issues becoming homicides? Chief Obrey did not have any statistics at this time but noted many homicides in the past 25 years are Domestic Violence related.

Officers receive yearly training on handling domestic violence issues including de-escalation training; Chief Obrey indicated that in the hiring process they look for officers that can take control of a situation but also can communicate with those individuals involved in these incidents.

A question was asked if the officers can remove any guns in the home if there is a safety issue? In procedure, 310.4 (h) *seize any firearms or other dangerous weapons in the home, if appropriate and legally permitted, for safekeeping or as evidence.*

MCFD (SOG) – Staging at Domestic Violence calls: The fire department will stage support set up in domestic violence issues – supporting the police department, often without lights and sirens, close to the location to assist if needed. Scenarios were discussed for different procedures in staging medical care. Chief Boulden did indicate that the staging procedure does not apply to events with an active shooter.
