SUMMARY

In the 2023 General Session, the Legislature of the State of Utah allocated \$47,738,855 of Federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA), Emergency Rental Assistance (ERA), and State funds to the Office of Homeless Services Deeply Affordable Housing Fund (DAHF). This competitive grant program will support the acquisition, construction, and rehabilitation of projects that serve households whose income is no more than 30% of the area median income. All projects must provide supportive services to households residing in DAHF-designated units. This year, additional focus is being placed on households experiencing chronic homelessness and families experiencing homelessness.

Applications were submitted on July 17, 2023. A total of twenty-one (21) projects were submitted for review, totaling \$105,911,906. A group of community experts reviewed applications to provide recommendations to the Council for approval. Reading and scoring were completed on August 3, 2023.

After reviewing and scoring applications, fifteen (15) projects were recommended for the full \$47,739,856 in available funding, which will create 363 deeply affordable units. Contract negotiations will start immediately upon approval by the Council.
