

ORDINANCE NO. 1093

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING DRAPER CITY MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 3-3-140 PERTAINING TO THE DISPOSAL OF SURPLUS PROPERTY.

WHEREAS, Draper City Code Section 3-3-140 Authorizes the City Council to approve the disposal of surplus property other than a significant parcel of real property; and

WHEREAS, Draper City desires to streamline the process used to surplus property, and recommends the City Council amend the City Code to allow property valued less than \$2,500 to be disposed of through public auction or other methods designed to best serve the interests of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of Draper City hereby finds this action is in the best interest of the public's health, safety, and general welfare.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF DRAPER CITY, STATE OF UTAH AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Amendment. The Draper City Council hereby amends and adopts 3-3-140 of the Draper City Municipal Code to read as attached hereto as Exhibit "A".

Section 2. Severability. If any section, part, or provision of this Ordinance is held invalid, or unenforceable, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect any other portion of this Ordinance, and all sections, parts, and provisions of this Ordinance shall be severable.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its passage.

EXHIBIT "A"

d) All disposal, leases, or subleases of such property of the City other than a significant parcel of real property, shall be made, as nearly as possible, under the same conditions and limitations as required by this chapter for the purchase of property including notice and bidding procedures.

(1) The City Purchasing Agent may authorize at the Agent's discretion under terms and conditions as the Agent may deem fair and appropriate and considering intended use and interest of the City, the sale, trade, or exchange of surplus property not originally included in the Fixed Asset Register and/or property that is reasonably expected to raise less than \$2,500, through public auction or other method designed to best serve the interests of City residents and produce a fair return.

~~(e)~~ (2) The City Council may also authorize at its discretion and under such terms and conditions as it may deem desirable, fair and appropriate, considering intended use, property tax value, and the interests of the City, the sale, trade, exchange, lease or sublease of any surplus property, through public auction or other method designed to best serve the interests of City residents and produce a fair return.
