III. Business		
A. Discussion		
1. Review/Discussion of Amazon SLC1 Contingency Plan	Tara Behunin gave a great overview of the RMP submitted by Amazon. A highlight of who the plan was distributed to, the outline of roles of Fire, LE, Hospital, and Hazardous Waste Contractor. The plan also included outlines of onsite facility response equipment and personnel roles and responsibilities. The plan addressed an all-hazard response environment. One item for follow-up is how the facility reports to the LEPC. A letter of acknowledgment that the LEPC has received the plan will be signed and sent to Amazon. An invitation to tour the facility was extended to the LEPC. A question was asked: If a facility submits a Risk Management Plan (RMP), what are the security and access for the records? Val Greensides responded that those records are on a UFA (as the administrative piece for the LEPC) secure server, and information required to be shared with Law Enforcement and Fire is provided. Other requests are under GRAMA, and information identified as classified and allowable for redaction can be done in that process.	
2. Reappointments and applications	Tara Behunin covered Ron Lund and Kevin Arthur, who are currently up for reappointment, and Emily Paskett, a new appointment, is waiting for SLCo council approval.	
3. Overview of the SERCA Meeting	Ron Lund provided some takeaways from the SERCA meeting. SERCA can make recommendations to the SERC. One recommendation was made for unifying the	

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	Tier II reporting and funding a system that can be used throughout the state. Doug Bitton, a member of the SERC advisory, has been having discussions with states that do this already. Ron also stated that the SERCA reminds everyone that the State Liaisons work with and support the LEPC but are not an enforcement arm. SERCA is working on a letter outlining the interaction, roles, and responsibilities of reporting to the SERC LEPC activities and the need to submit an Emergency Response Plan (ERP) annually. The SERCA will also outline participation from LEPC at the SERCA meeting. SERCA has started three subcommittees; they hope to move forward with initiatives discussed with the SERCA and follow them through from decision-making to completion. Current initiatives include qualification and process for clean-up contractors and transportation fees for transporting through Utah.	
B. Approval of Meeting Minutes		A motion was made by Tara Behunin and a second by Dan Mortensen to accept the minutes as written. The motion was unanimous.
C. Round Table - Reports		
1. State Fire Marshal Office		
2. DEQ	Tom Daniels reported that he and Robin Osterhoudt are working with Bre Bockstahler with Region VIII EPA to offer a facility Tier II reporting training at the end of September. Tom will forward details about the meeting and ask that it be distributed to our Tier II facility reps.	
3. SLCo Environmental Health	Ron Lund reports that they are seeing an increase in workload for Hazmat-type events. Diesel fuel spills, facility discharges, and fires. Several diesel spills on the freeways lately.	

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	A question was asked based on what SLCO Health is seeing: Can the LEPC or SERCA do something to help with mitigation efforts? Ron replied that what they see are the results of accidents, not intentional. But they have also been Issuing several Clean Water Act violations. They will be keeping an eye on those as this may be somewhere that we can discuss possible remediation efforts.	
4. State of Utah DEM Liaison	Carly Sands reminded the group that she is ready to support in any way.	
5. Other	Tara Behunin reported notification from Tooele County the Tooele Army Depot is conducting controlled detonations on unserviceable ammunition. Reports of noise, windows rattling. There is no threat to the public and recognized the great job of public notification from Tooele County and Tooele Army Depot. Tara also confirmed that VECC and the first responder communities have been notified. Val reported an upcoming training hosted by UDOT. The Utah Transportation Conference will be held October 24-26 at the Mountain American Expo Center in Sandy. Helen Peters reported that she will attend and that UDOT is looking for presenters. She asked if the LEPC would like to present. Tara will follow up. Paul Prieto, with Dairy Farmers of America (DFA), introduced himself and discussed that as a Regional Manager, he is working with their facilities and encouraging them to be more involved in the LEPC.
