Ogden Mayor Mike Caldwell welcomed the group. He said there have been 80 years of documented efforts for the Ogden Canyon Trail, and he expressed his appreciation to Carlos Braceras, UDOT Executive Director, WFRC and UTA for the vision of active transportation and ways to move more effectively along the Wasatch Front and be happier and lead richer lives. He talked about the Ogden BRT, calling it a transformational and generational project. He said some of these active transportation corridors will be the trees planted for our children to enjoy the shade of. He said he appreciates the Department and willingness to partner, even during difficult times. He complimented the patience and professionalism of everyone in the room, and said the support given to different agencies is what allows the State of Utah to do what no one else gets to do; he said the secret sauce of Utah is finding ways to work together with patience and persistence. He thanked the group for their services, acknowledged that they are pulled in many different directions, and expressed his pride in the work that is done.

LOCAL AREA PRESENTATION

Brett Slater, UDOT Region One Program Manager, reviewed recent, current and upcoming projects in the area. Over the past 10 years, \$815,376,650 and 169 projects have been allocated to Weber County.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Mitch Shaw, UDOT Region One Communications Manager, read an emailed comment from Ken Naylor, Water Master of the Palmer Weir Water Users Association, expressing his concerns regarding a ditch that runs along the south side of 9000 South between 1850 West to 1300 West, and the Department's 9000 South widening project.

Andrew Gruber, Executive Director of Wasatch Front Regional Council, announced that WFRC is on track to adopt the 2024-2029 Transportation Improvement Program that is integrated with the STIP for the whole State. He said the whole program contains \$10 billion in critical transportation investment roadway, transit and active transportation projects. He thanked everyone who partnered in the process, and talked about the significant public engagement during the TIP development, and the hundreds of comments received, and acknowledged the public engagement and partnership of teams working together.

<u>Davy Ratchford, Snowbasin General Manager, expressed his appreciation for UDOT's partnership, and talked about safety concerns and asked for support for needed improvements of Trapper's Loop Road</u>. He also expressed Snowbasin's support for the future Mountain Green Interchange.

FHWA REPORT

Ivan Marrero, FHWA Division Administrator, announced a \$24,494,147 RAISE grant was awarded to UDOT on June 28 for the First/Last Mile Connections: Improving Communities' Quality of Life project. He also reported that \$750,000 RAISE planning grant funding was awarded to Spring City Corporation and Sanpete County for the Spine through the Heart of Utah project, which will complete a feasibility study, benefit-cost analysis, environmental review and 30% design for approximately 47 miles of multi-use trails in Sanpete County. Ivan also reported that \$8.3 million Nationally Significant Federal Lands and Tribal Transportation Project program funds were awarded to Tooele County for the Ibapah Road Safety and Rehabilitation project.

Ivan announced Notice of Funding Opportunities (NOFO) for the Multimodal Project Discretionary Grant (MPDF): \$1.8 billion for the National Infrastructure Project Assistance (MEGA) program, \$3.1 billion for the Infrastructure for Rebuilding America (INFRA) program, and \$675 million for the Rural Surface Transportation Grant (Rural) program. Applications are due August 21. Ivan also announced a NOFO of \$34 million for the Advanced Digital Construction Management Systems (ADCMS) grant program. Applications are due August 28.

Ivan also talked about the Utah Federal Discretionary Grant Workshop on September 19 and 20 in Salt Lake.

UDOT SCOREBOARD

Carmen Swanwick, UDOT Project Development Director, reported on the construction program. Robert Miles, UDOT Traffic and Safety Director, reported on the Safety dashboard.

UTAH TRANSIT AUTHORITY ANNUAL REPORT

Utah Transit Authority Board of Trustees members Carlton Christensen, Beth Holbrook and Jeff Acerson, reviewed UTA's Strategic Plan and 5-year capital plan. They reviewed the upcoming MidValley Connector, S-Line Extension, and Westside Express projects. They talked about workforce strategy and labor relations, and UTA's service vision. They reviewed systemwide ridership of 2021, 2022 and 2023, and talked about ski services for the 2023 and 2024 seasons. They reviewed the OGX system, which includes 13 BRT stations, 1.5 miles of dedicated lanes, 11 all-electric buses, 19 signal priority lights, 10-15 minute service on weekdays, and zero fare for 3 years.

I-15; SR-97 Widening of 5600 South - Funding Addition/Scope Change

Region One requested approval to add \$140,000,000 of TIF funds to the I-15; SR-97, Widening of 5600 South project to add the realignment of the Davis and Weber Canal to the project scope, and address construction and right of way inflation costs, as well as the cost of additional material quantities. The I-15; Payson Main Street Interchange (Phase 1) project will construct an interchange to provide more access to Payson and the areas south of I-15. Funding for the project in SB2 is contingent upon a "substantial right of way donation". The requested funds are proposed for the preparation of right of way plans, documents and related activities necessary to facilitate the right of way donation. A future request will address funding necessary for the balance of the project. MAG approved this request on July 31. Commissioner Cramer moved to approve the request and Commissioner Van Tassell seconded the motion. The request was unanimously approved.

Region Four requested approval to abandon the \$1,157,000 400 North and 100 West Roundabout, Moab City project, and return the remaining federal funds, per the City's request. Moab applied for and received Joint Highway Committee funding to fund the project. During the design phase, the estimates to complete the proposed project were much higher than the City anticipated, totalling \$2,650,000. Moab City will be responsible to pay the match (6.77%) on the expended \$300,000 in PE costs to date, which is approximately \$21,000. Commissioner Van Tassell moved to approve the request and Commissioner Cramer seconded the motion. The request was unanimously approved.

SR-18; Snow Canyon State Park White Rocks Acceleration Lane - Scope Change

Region Four requested approval to add scope and change the name of the SR-18; Snow Canyon State Park White Rocks Acceleration Lane project to SR-18; Snow Canyon Park Access and Parking project. The original scope included a right turn deceleration lane and right turn acceleration lane at the White Rocks trailhead parking lot on SR-18 near MP 11.7. During the design phase of the project, Snow Canyon State Park sent a request to UDOT asking to expand the White Rocks parking lot. The Region evaluated the request, and due to limited sight distance, the vertical and horizontal curves near the access and the profile grade, they determined that without a left turn deceleration lane, the additional traffic at the White Rocks trailhead would increase safety concerns at the location. The proposed modified scope would develop a frontage road and new parking lot, and also include a multi-use path parallel to the frontage road. These changes will greatly improve the safety of those entering and exiting the park by providing increased sight distance and turn lanes for each turning movement. The modified project can be designed and constructed within the existing budget, and construction is anticipated in spring 2024. Commissioner Law moved to approve the request and Commissioner Van Tassell seconded the motion. The request was unanimously approved.

The project is being paired with the South Cedar Interchange grant proposal for a Multimodal Project Discretionary grant (MPDG) application. If selected, the project would include climbing lanes on I-15 from MP 43 to 58, and the preferred alternative from the South Cedar Interchange EA. <u>Ibapah Road Safety and Rehabilitation - New Project - For Information Only</u>

Valued at \$18,131,122.13, the Ibapah Road Safety and Rehabilitation project was recently awarded grants from the Federal Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023; Rural Surface Transportation grant, and Nationally Significant Federal Lands and Tribal Projects programs. Tooele County also provided a local match. The scope of this new project will rehabilitate the existing pavement, install guardrails, update traffic signs and upgrade drainage culverts.

Neffs Canyon Trailhead Improvements - New Project - For Information Only

The Neffs Canyon Trailhead Improvements project was recently awarded \$800,000 from the Federal Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023, and will be funded with the required match of \$58,093 from Millcreek City. The project will resurface the Neffs Canyon Parking Lot and install new restrooms.

US-89 Widening from 200 South, Pleasant Grove to 500 East, American Fork - For Information Only

On July 31, MAG approved the request to transfer \$7,371,219 from the State Street, Pleasant Grove 200 South to American Fork, 500 East, Phase 1 project to the new US-89; Widening from Pleasant Grove to 500 East in American Fork, Phase 2 project. Due to challenges obtaining an agreement with UPRR, the project has been split into two phases. Phase 1 will focus on improvements at the 500 East in American Fork and Pleasant Grove Boulevard/200 South areas, and Phase 2 will focus on road widening and intersection improvements in between those locations, and will be completed when the agreements are completed.

Patchwork Parkway's Interpretive Signage & Kiosks - For Information Only

Utah's Patchwork Parkway has coordinated with the National Scenic Byway Program (NSBP) and received funds to build Utah's Patchwork Parkway's Interpretive Signage and Kiosks along SR-143. The \$312,358 project is in partnership with Iron and Garfield counties, along with the communities of Parowan, Brian Head and Panguitch, and will construct nine interpretive Kiosk facilities, replace four byway wayfinding/directional metal signs, and produce printed and digital-accessible interpretive materials. The project is aligned with the byway Corridor Management Plan and Interpretive & Signage Master Plan to develop safe accessible sites to provide historical, archaeological, cultural, natural, recreational and scenic interpretive information to enhance the traveler's experience. A discussion about sign replacements took place.

ADMINISTRATIVE RULES REVIEW

R940-3: State Infrastructure Bank Fund - For Approval

Peter Asplund, UDOT Policy and Legislative Services Deputy Director, reviewed and requested approval of the changes to R940-3: State Infrastructure Bank Fund, which were needed due to State Infrastructure Bank (SIB) amendments provided in SB 185 (line 1854), which requires UDOT to establish a separate account in the SIB for infrastructure loans for publicly owned infrastructure projects in greenfield areas that are located no less than one mile from an existing municipal or county water supply, water distribution facility or wastewater facility. Commissioner Law moved to approve the request and Commissioner Menlove seconded the motion. The request was unanimously approved.

R940-10: Guidelines for Department Participation in Transportation Reinvestment Zones - For Review

Leif Elder, UDOT Policy and Legislative Services Director, reviewed new rule R940-10: Guidelines for Department Participation in Transportation Reinvestment Zones, which establishes a process for Department participation in a Transportation Reinvestment Zone (TRZ), created under Section 11-13-227. The objective of Department participation in a TRZ is to enhance the State transportation system by accelerating State highway projects or projects on local highways that are eligible for Federal funds in areas where the projects are likely to stimulate increased local tax revenue that can be used to offset the cost of those projects. Pursuant to Utah Code Section 11-13-227, two or more public entities can enter into an agreement to create a TRZ, including the boundaries of the zone; define the specific transportation improvements that are needed, and establish the terms for sharing increased property tax and sales tax generated within the defined TRZ zone. Revenue generated within a TRZ can be used for a wide variety of transportation improvements, including roads, sidewalks, bike and walking paths and transit. In addition to providing a tool for local entities to work together on infrastructure issues within a TRZ, TRZs are also a potential tool for local entities to formally partner with the State for infrastructure projects. That partnership can be between the State and a single local entity, or multiple local entities.
