- 3 R277-495-1. Authority and Purpose.
- 4 (1) This rule is authorized by:
- 5 (a) Utah Constitution Article X, Section 3, which vests general control and supervision
- 6 over public education in the Board;
- 7 (b) Subsection 53E-3-401(4), which allows the Board to make rules to execute the
- 8 Board's duties and responsibilities under the Utah Constitution and state law;
- 9 (c) Subsection 53G-8-202(2)(c)(i), which directs the Superintendent to develop a
- 10 conduct and discipline policy model for elementary and secondary public schools; and
- 11 (d) 47 CFR, Part 54, Children's Internet Protection Act, which requires schools and
- 12 libraries that have computers with internet access to certify they have internet safety
- 13 policies and technology protection measures in place to receive discounted internet
- 14 access and services.
- 15 (2) The purpose of this rule is to direct all LEAs and public schools to adopt policies,
- individually or collectively as school districts or consortia of charter schools, governing the
- 17 possession and use of electronic devices including:
- 18 (a) both LEA-owned and privately-owned, while on public school premises or during
- 19 participation in school activities; and
- 20 (b) for LEA-owned devices, wherever the LEA-owned devices are used.

22 **R277-495-2. Definitions.** 

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- 23 (1) "Acceptable use policy" means a document stipulating constraints and practices
- that a user shall accept prior to a user accessing an LEA's, or any school within an LEA's,
- 25 network or the Internet.
- 26 (2) "Electronic device" means a device that is used for audio, video, or text
- communication or any other type of computer or computer-like instrument including:
- 28 (a) a smart phone;
- 29 (b) a smart or electronic watch; (c) a tablet; or

- 30 (d) a virtual reality device.
- 31 (3) "Guest" means an individual:
- 32 (a) who is not a student, employee, or designated volunteer of a public school;
- and (b) who is on school property or at the site of a school-sponsored activity or event.
- 34 (4) "Inappropriate matter" means pornographic or indecent material as defined in
- 35 Subsection 76-10-12[<del>53</del>]35(1)(a).
- 36 (5) "LEA" includes for purposes of this rule, the Utah Schools for the Deaf and the
- 37 Blind.
- 38 (6) "LEA-owned electronic device" means a device that is used for audio, video, text
- 39 communication, or other type of computer or computer-like instrument that is identified as
- 40 being owned, provided, issued or lent by the LEA to a student or employee.
- 41 (7) "Policy" means an electronic device use policy as required by this rule that
- 42 contains:
- 43 (a) permissible uses of an electronic device under certain circumstances; or
- 44 (b) restricted uses of an electronic devices under certain circumstances.
- 45 (8) "Privately-owned electronic device" means a device, including an electronic device
- 46 that is used for audio, video, text communication, or other type of computer or computer-
- 47 like instrument that is not owned or issued by the LEA to a student, or employee.
- 48 (9) "Public school" means a school or public school program, grades kindergarten
- 49 through 12, that is part of the Utah public school system, including a school with a distance
- 50 learning program or alternative program.
- 51 (10) "Student," for purposes of this rule, means an individual enrolled as a student at
- an LEA regardless of the part-time nature of the enrollment or the age of the individual.
- 53 (11)(a) "The Children's Internet Protection Act (CIPA)" means federal regulations enacted
- 54 by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and administrated by the Schools
- 55 and Libraries Division of the FCC.
- 56 (b) CIPA and companion laws, the Neighborhood Children's Internet Protection Act
- 57 (NCIPA) and the Protecting Children in the 21st Century Act, require recipients of federal
- technology funds to comply with certain Internet filtering and policy requirements.

- 59 (12) "Utah Education Telehealth Network or UETN" means the Utah Education and
- Telehealth Network created in Section <u>53B-17-105</u>.
- 61 R277-495-3. Requirement of Electronic Device Use Policy, Creation, and Access.
- 62 (1) An LEA shall require all schools under the LEA's supervision to have a policy or
- policies for students, employees and, where appropriate, for guests, governing the
- use of electronic devices on school premises and at school sponsored activities.
- 65 (2) An LEA shall review and approve policies regularly.
- 66 (3) An LEA shall encourage schools to involve teachers, parents, students, school
- employees, school community councils, and community members in developing the
- 68 local policies.
- 69 (4) An LEA shall provide copies of the LEA's policies or clear electronic links to policies
- at LEA offices, in schools and on the LEA's website in the same location as the LEA's
- 71 data governance plan required in R277-487.
- 72 (5) An LEA and all schools within the LEA shall cooperate to ensure that all policies within
- a school or school district are consistent and accessible to parents and community
- 74 members.
- 75 (6) An LEA shall provide reasonable public notice and at least one public hearing or
- meeting to address a proposed or revised acceptable use policy.
- 77 (7) An LEA shall retain documentation of the policy review and adoption actions.

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- 79 R277-495-4. LEA Electronic Device Policy Requirements.
- 80 (1) An LEA's policy shall include at least the following:
- 81 (a) definitions of electronic devices covered by policy;
- 82 (b) prohibitions on the use of electronic devices in ways that:
- 83 (i) significantly impair academic excellence;
- 84 (ii) bully, humiliate, harass, or intimidate school-related individuals, including students,
- employees, and guests, consistent with R277-609 and R277-613; or
- 86 (iii) violate local, state, or federal laws;

- 87 (c) the prohibition of access by students, LEA employees and guests to inappropriate
- 88 matter on the internet and world wide web while using LEA equipment, services, or
- 89 connectivity whether on or off school property;
- 90 (e) directives on the safety and security of students when using social media and other
- 91 forms of electronic communications:
- 92 (f) directives on unauthorized access, including hacking and other unlawful activities
- 93 by a user of an LEA electronic device; and
- 94 (g) directives on unauthorized disclosure, use and dissemination of personal student
- 95 information under R277-487 and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act
- 96 (FERPA)34 CFR, Part 99.
- 97 (2) In addition to the requirements of Subsection (1), an LEA's policies for student use
- 98 of electronic devices shall include directives regarding the following:
- 99 (a) the use of privately-owned electronic devices during standardized assessments; (b)
- 100 administrative penalties for misuse of electronic devices during school hours or at a
- 101 school-sponsored;
- 102 (c) violations of an LEA's acceptable use policies that may result in confiscation of
- 103 LEA-owned electronic devices or restricted access on the LEA's:
- 104 (d) a student's personal responsibility for devices assigned or provided to a student by
- the LEA, both for loss or damage of electronic devices and use of electronic devices
- 106 consistent with the LEA's directives;
- 107 (e) use of electronic devices in violation of an LEA's or teacher's instructional policies
- may result in the confiscation of privately-owned electronic devices for a designated
- 109 period; and
- 110 (f) uses of privately-owned electronic devices to bully or harass other students or
- employees during school hours or at school-sponsored activities that may result in the
- 112 student being subject to LEA disciplinary action.
- 113 (3) In addition to the provisions of Subsections (1) and (2), directives for employee use
- 114 of electronic devices shall include:
- 115 (a) notice that use of electronic devices to access inappropriate matter on LEA-owned
- 116 electronic devices or privately-owned electronic devices on school property, at school-

- sponsored events or using school connectivity may have criminal, employment or student
- disciplinary consequences, and if appropriate, may be reported to law enforcement; (b)
- 119 notice that an employee is responsible for LEA-issued electronic devices at all times and
- misuse of an electronic device may have employment consequences, regardless of the
- 121 user; and
- 122 (c) required staff responsibilities in educating minors on appropriate online activities, as
- required by Section <u>53G-7-1202</u>, and in supervising such activities.
- 124 (4) An LEA's policies shall also include the following:
- 125 (a) prohibitions or restrictions on unauthorized use that would cause invasions of
- reasonable expectations of student and employee privacy;
- 127 (b) procedures to report the misuse of electronic devices; and
- 128 (c) potential disciplinary actions toward students or employees for violation of local
- policies regarding the use of electronic devices; and
- 130 (d) exceptions to the policy for special circumstances, health-related reasons and
- 131 emergencies, if any.
- 132 (5) An LEA shall certify annually through UETN, and as required by the FCC, that the
- 133 LEA has a CIPA-compliant acceptable use policy.

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## 135 **R277-495-5. Required School Level Training.**

- 136 (1) A school shall provide, within the first 45 days of each school year, a school-wide or
- in-classroom training to employees and students that covers:
- 138 (a) the contents of the school's policy;
- 139 (b) the importance of digital citizenship;
- 140 (c) the LEA's conduct and discipline related consequences as related to a violation of the
- 141 school's policy;
- 142 (d) the LEA's general conduct and discipline policies as described in Section 53G8-202;
- 143 and
- (e) the benefits of connecting to the Internet and utilizing the school's Internet filters, while
- on school premises.

146 (2) A school that adopts a permissible use policy shall: 147 (a) within the first 45 days of each school-year, provide school-wide or in-148 classroom training to employees and students that covers: 149 (i) the elements described in Subsections (1)(a) through (e); and 150 (ii) specific rules governing the permissible and restricted uses of personal electronic 151 devices while in a classroom; and 152 (b) require that each educator who allows the use of a personal electronic device in the 153 classroom clearly communicates to parents and students the conditions under which the 154 use of a personal electronic device is allowed. 155 156 R277-495-6. Resources and Required Assurances. 157 The Superintendent may provide resources, upon request, for an LEA 158 regarding electronic device policies, including: 159 (a) sample acceptable use policies; 160 (b) general best practices for electronic device use as outlined in R277-922; and 161 (c) materials for digital citizenship as outlined in Section 53G-7-1202. 162 (2) An LEA shall post the LEA's electronic device use policy on the LEA's website and 163 provide a link to the Board through the annual assurances document described in 164 R277108. 165 166 R277-495-7.
