Focus on reducing principal burdens for reporting requirements

Currently there are several website posting requirements

- Some may be met with a single URL provided by the SCT
- Some can be met through Google docs
- The others are school-specific and require less upkeep

Final Report Review

No significant findings

Identified as a better tool for follow-up rather than an investigative tool

Carry-over Review

>10% carry-over for past year, past 2 prior years, or 3 consecutive years

Leniency for years surrounding covid

Carry-over 2022-2023 Report

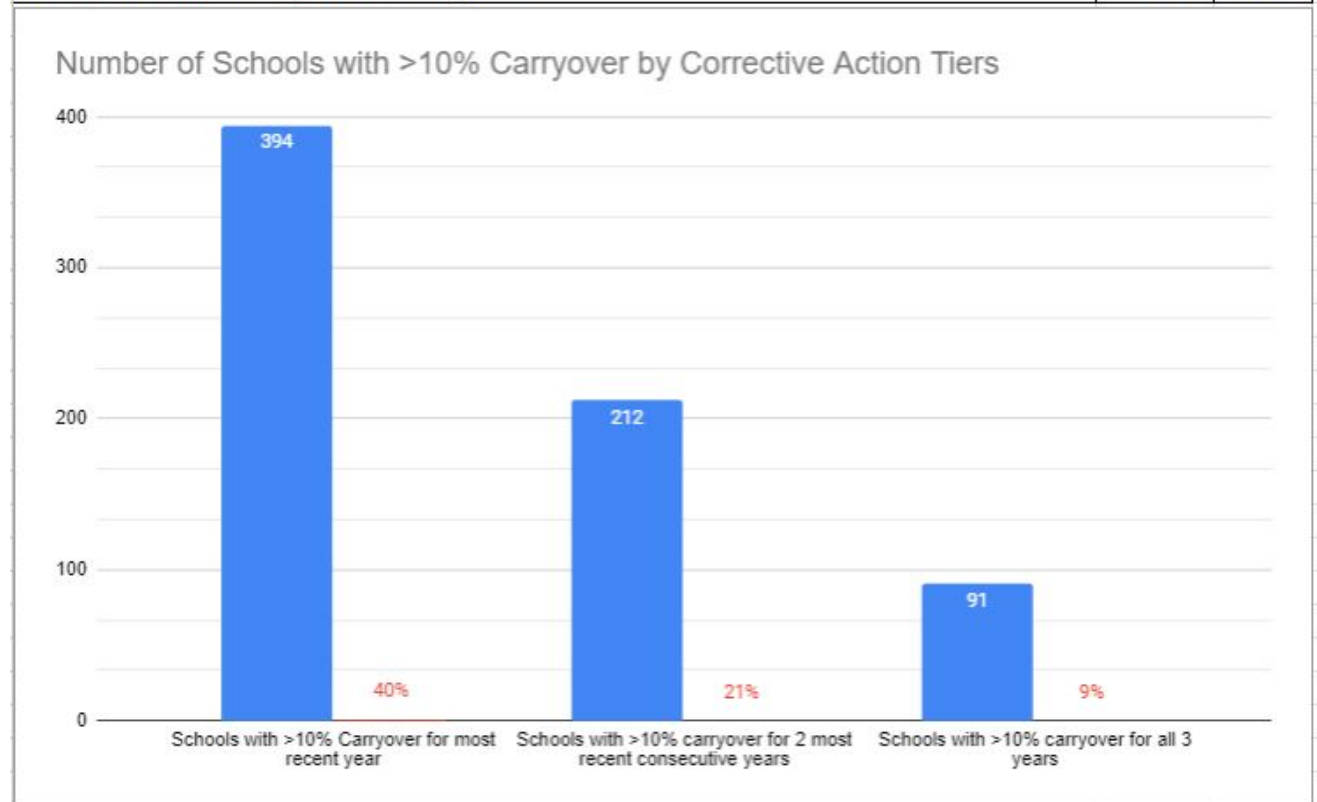
Temperature gauge

Upcoming Plan Review

- Negative/excessive carryover
- Academic, student-centered goals
- Board prioritized academic areas
- Allowable expenditures - outlined in Rule
- Consistency with Code & Rule
- Spelling
- No student identifiable information
- Connection between goal, academic area, planned expenditures
- Backup plan
- Quorum for council vote



Full (comprehensive) review

Reviewed includes:

- 2020-2021 plan writing (accuracy/transparency), final reports
- Unallowable program expenditures - general ledger for 5420
- School Community council membership seating and election processes
- Internal controls over purchases using School LAND Trust funds

Corrective actions

Unallowable expenditures

Would the expense be allowable, had it been planned?

- Yes - provide training
- No - pay back the funds

Focus on training

- LEA ownership
- State resources

Follow-up

- LEA's intention for correction
- Submission of follow-up documentation
- State resources and training opportunities/offering

Improving Compliance Monitoring

Current Practice - Full (comprehensive) compliance reviews for an LEA occur once every 10 years

New Goal is once every 4-5 years

- FTE
- Information and program reports that provide most value
- Development of training and compliance cycle
