- 1. In support of its purposes, AAPAC may:
- a. provide valuable insights by representing their stakeholder groups in advising the Board on:
  - i. the impact of accountability and assessment issues; and
  - ii. business rules in the implementation of assessment and accountability programs;

78	Appointment:	
79	Interested individuals may apply to serve as voting members of AAPAC. AAPAC	
80	voting members shall be appointed by the Board. Staff shall review applications	
81	submitted by individuals interested in serving on APPAC and make recommendations to	
82	the Board for appointment.

84	Term of Service:	
85	AAPAC voting members shall be appointed for four-year terms. Committee	
86	member terms of service shall be staggered so that approximately half of the members	
87	are appointed every two years. If a voting member misses two or more consecutive	
88	meetings without being excused by the Assistant Superintendent of Student Learning,	
89	the committee may request that the Board remove the member and appoint a	
90	replacement.

92	Committee Leadership:	
93	1. AAPAC meetings shall be facilitated by Assessment section staff, leveraging the	
94	Board's technical assistance consultants for technical assistance when needed.	
95	The Assistant Superintendent for Student Learning shall:	
96	<ul> <li>a. coordinate meeting logistics with AAPAC members;</li> </ul>	
97	b. preside at AAPAC meetings;	
98	c. report to Board leadership and committee chairs as requested; and	
99	d. invite other stakeholders and additional Board staff to participate in AAPAC	
100	meetings as needed.
