The regularly scheduled meeting of the Naples City Council was held October 12, 2023, 7:30 p.m., at the Naples City Office, 1420 East 2850 South, Naples, Uintah County, Utah.

Council members attending were Dean Baker, Robert Hall, Gordon Kitchen, Ross Morton, Dan Olsen and Kenneth Reynolds.

Others attending were Daryl Wilson, Daren Anderson, David O'Riordan, Brooks Jones, Nathan Simper, Gwen Harrison, Micheal Davis and Nikki Kay.

Mayor Dean Baker welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Mayor Baker opened the meeting with the pledge of allegiance and Kenneth Reynolds offered the invocation.

Mayor Baker presented the agenda for approval and said he wanted to add something under other matters. Gordon Kitchen **moved** to approve the agenda. Dan Olsen **seconded** the motion. The motion passed with all voting aye.

Robert Hall **moved** to go into a public hearing to discuss the possible vacation of the 1150 East Street. Kenneth Reynolds **seconded** the motion. The motion passed with all voting in the affirmative.

Micheal explained this was a subdivision the County adopted a number of years ago. He said it begins on 2000 South and goes back into the B.H.I. property. Micheal pointed out on

the map where the road bends at 1375 East and goes down to 2100 South, which extends back to the 1150 East street. The property was at one time owned by the County, sold to another individual, and then purchased by B.H.I. Micheal explained the 1150 East street, recorded as part of the subdivision, does not play a part in any plans B.H.I. has for the property. Micheal said B.H.I. would like to vacate the 1150 East street and a small portion of 2100 South. The plans presented show where B.H.I. will put a turn around at the end of 2100 South. Micheal stated the City sent letters out notifying adjacent property owners of the proposed changes and the public hearing was noticed on the website and at the property site. He explained that Adam's Body and Paint has property on 2000 South and 1375 East and they didn't have any issues with the proposal and no written objections were received. The discussion was then opened up for public comment.

Daryl Wilson asked about the utility lines that were put in years ago on the south end of the property, he said he was curious because if you do away with the right-of-way, it would be hard to get it back. Daren Anderson with B.H.I. said the vacating of the road would have no impact on the utility right-of-way. Mr. Wilson asked what B.H.I.'s future plans were. Mr. Anderson said they have no plans right now, he said B.H.I. purchased the property and in case they want to grow in the future, they can grow there. Mr. Anderson said they have no plans to vacate the utility right-of-way, they are just requesting to vacate the road that is in the middle of the purchased property. Mr. Wilson also asked about the water or irrigation line that comes across a portion of the property. Mr. Anderson said they are also not doing anything in the area that Mr. Wilson pointed to on the map. Gwen Harrison stated the road that B.H.I. is looking to vacate has never been built, it was recorded as part of a proposed subdivision but it was never built. With no other comments or concerns from the public, Kenneth Reynolds **moved** to go out of the public hearing. Gordon Kitchen **seconded** the motion. The motion passed with all voting in the affirmative.

Robert Hall **moved** to approve and vacate the property as explained, to vacate 1150 East street and to shorten 2100 South. Dan Olsen **seconded** the motion. The motion passed with the following roll call vote:



Ordinance # 23-252

AN ORDINANCE VACATING 1150 EAST STREET, A PORTION OF 2100 SOUTH, AND THE 60' RIGHT-OF-WAY IN LOT 2 OF MONTGOMERY SUBDIVISION IN NAPLES CITY.

WHEREAS, HDE, LLC purchased property known as Montgomery Subdivision, including property located in the SE ¼ of Section 36, TAS, R21E, S.L.B.&M in Naples City and;

WHEREAS, HDE, LLC petitioned the Naples City Council to vacate 1150 East Street and 500' of 2100 South more fully described below, and;

WHEREAS, by motion and vote of the Naples City Council on October 12, 2023, at a regularly scheduled and noticed public meeting, the Naples City Council approved HDE, LLC's petition to vacate 1150 East and shorten 2100 South as described below and;

WHEREAS, HDE, LLC has agreed to construct a turnaround on at the end of 2100 South and;

WHEREAS, Utah Code Anno. §10-9a-609.5(4) states that "the legislative body may adopt an ordinance granting a petition to vacate some or all of a public street, right-of-way, or easement if the legislative body finds that: (a) good cause exists for the vacation; and (b) neither the public interest nor any person will be materially injured by the vacation."

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Legislative Body of Naples City that:

Article I – Findings of Fact and Conclusions

1. Naples City finds that good cause exists for the vacation 1150 East Street, 500' portion of 2100 South Street and the 60' right-of-way easement on Lot 2 of Montgomery Subdivision.
2. Neither the public interest nor any person will be materially injured by the vacation.

Article II – Description of Property to be Vacated

The following is the legal description of the property subject to vacation under this ordinance.

ROAD VACATION DESCRIPTION

CONTAINS 1.96 ACRES MORE OR LESS.

60' RIGHT OF WAY EASEMENT VACATION DESCRIPTION

BEGINNING AT A POINT ON THE NORTH LINE OF THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER OF SECTION 36, TOWNSHIP 4 SOUTH, RANGE 21 EAST, SALT LAKE BASE AND MERIDIAN, UNTAH COUNTY, UTAH, WHICH BEARS S88°09'25"W 1651.55 FEET FROM THE EAST QUARTER CORNER OF SAID SECTION; THENCE S02°06'32"E PARALLEL WITH THE EAST LINE OF SAID SOUTHEAST QUARTER 637.44 FEET (636.48 FEET RECORD DISTANCE) TO THE NORTH LINE OF 2100 SOUTH STREET; THENCE S88°07'01"W ALONG SAID NORTH LINE OF 2100 SOUTH STREET 60.00 FEET;

THENCE N02°06'32"W PARALLEL WITH SAID EAST LINE OF THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER 637.48 FEET (636.52 FEET RECORD DISTANCE) TO SAID NORTH LINE OF THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER; THENCE N88°09'25"E ALONG SAID NORTH LINE OF THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER 60.00 FEET TO THE POINT OF BEGINNING. Article III – Vacation of 1150 East Street, 500' portion of 2100 South Street and 60 Right-of-Way Easement

The Mayor and City Council of Naples City herby vacate the property as described above

Article IV – Other Directives

By virtue of this ordinance, and pursuant to Utah Code Ann. §10-9a609.5, the mayor is authorized to execute a plat map detailing the portion of 1150 East Street, 500' portion of 2100 South Street, and 60' Right-of-Way Easement in Lot 2 of Montgomery Subdivision subject to vacation under this ordinance. The Naples City Recorder is further directed to ensure that this ordinance and the executed plat map are recorded in the office of the Uintah County Recorder.

Article V – Effective Date

This ordinance shall become effective on the date of passing.

Dear Valued Members of the Utah League of Cities and Towns,

Enclosed you will find copies of the Utah League of Cities and Town's co-branded cards with UNITE's Dignity Index. These cards provide resources so that you can foster dignity in your community.

Following Tim Shriver's keynote address on UNITE and the Dignity Index at the ULCT Midyear Conference, League members reached out to staff asking what they could do to implement the principles and values that Tim Shriver outlined in their own communities. ULCT partnered with UNITE and the Dignity Index to commission these co-branded cards for each city hall statewide. We hope that these cards will be helpful for your community as we collectively work to foster dignity and respect so that we can tackle the challenging issues facing our communities.

Since these cards were commissioned, ULCT has also begun to collaborate with Governor Spencer Cox's "Disagree Better" initiative through the National Governor's Association. Additionally, ULCT membership voted unanimously to adopt a resolution detailing the importance of "Dignity and Civility in Local Politics" at the ULCT Annual Convention (2023-001). With these new developments, the League staff is also developing resources for our members, and we will share them with you once they are completed. Please distribute these cards however you see fit. You can circulate them amongst your council, staff, constituents, and whoever else will work to foster dignity in your community. If your community needs more cards, please let us know.
