EHDI* updates: CMV Conference Recap, HRSA NOFO	<p>Dr. McVicar provided the following updates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Recap of CMV Conference that occurred October 8–10, 2023, in Salt Lake City on the U of U campus in the SJ Quinney School of Law Building. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ It was a celebration of the first ten years of mandated legislation in the U.S. for testing for CMV, education, and screening. ○ There were 230 attendees, 30 families, 33 states represented, several provinces in Canada, and some individuals from Australia & Japan. ○ There were 13 state EHDI coordinators in attendance, the most ever. ○ Many authors, who were also parents of children affected by CMV, were in attendance to meet and speak with. ○ There were several presentations from the State of Minnesota regarding the initial 6 months of data after enacting their universal screening in February 2023. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Come Along on Minnesota’s Adventure through Congenital CMV Candyland - Cranial Ultrasound Comparisons in Asymptomatic and Symptomatic Infants Identified in a Universal Congenital Cytomegalovirus Screening Study in Minnesota - Newborn Screening Longitudinal Follow-up for Congenital CMV in Minnesota

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Dr. Megan Pesch, President of the National CMV Foundation, gave a presentation, Autism spectrum disorder and Congenital CMV: More than just a coincidence. ○ Presentations from the conference are publicly available to view on the conference website: cmv.usu.edu ● HRSA (Health Resources & Services Administration) EHDI Grant <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The current HRSA project is 4 years, which expires March 31, 2024. ○ EHDI recently applied for the next NOFO (notice of funding opportunity). ○ If received, it will start April 1, 2024, and would be a 5-year project. ○ The new HRSA project would include the same goals as the current one, with the additional overarching goal: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ To enhance the EHDI system infrastructure to improve language acquisition for deaf and hard of hearing children up to age 3. ● EHDI updates: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Will start accepting CHAP applications for children up to age 18. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Requirements are the same – still financially-based, families must be within 300% of the federal poverty guidelines. ▪ In contrast, our current program serves children younger than 6 years of age. ▪ Eligible children can still only receive one hearing aid per ear. ○ More information and applications can be found on our new EHDI, CMV, and CHAP websites: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ familyhealth.utah.gov/ehdi ▪ familyhealth.utah.gov/cm ▪ familyhealth.utah.gov/chap
