CLOSING REMARKS

Commissioner Stevenson spoke about touring the Western Sports Park and seeing the progress on the construction at the site. It is easy to see how the expansion will positively affect the surrounding area's development. Commissioner Stevenson also mentioned a previous meeting where the topic of fluoridated water was mentioned, which raised the question of how the issue could be placed on the ballot. Clerk Brian McKenzie stated it could be a ballot question, but he would need to research it further.

Commissioner Kamalu was recently on the front page of the Salt Lake Tribune. She had been at a press conference where the Governor announced his budget. Commissioner Kamalu had been invited due to being part of a task force for Davis County to work on shelter space for those experiencing homelessness. A new law this year requires Davis County to have a certain amount of shelter space, and this task force is working to make sure individuals are indoors by various means and out of the elements. The target is to have between 60 – 90 beds available to those who need them and a plan must be submitted to the State by August 2025. At the press conference, officials were asked to stand up front with the Governor. The Lt. Governor had Commissioner Kamalu stand next to Governor Cox, causing her to make the front page of the Salt Lake Tribune. The Governor committed a portion of the budget toward the homelessness issue in counties such as Davis.
