VI. Round Table Reports		
1. State Fire Marshal Office	Art Deyo introduced a new member of their staff, Paul Christensen. He also stated in 2024 their team is looking to offer several advanced hazmat courses. A focus will be on training for lithium-ion batteries. They are working to bring in contractors to help teach. They are also looking to provide all hazmat teams with a kit to contain lithium-ion batteries at the scene; these batteries have a high risk of reigniting if not encapsulated appropriately. Art and his team are testing out the product now for the kit. Fire Marshal's office is encouraging the utilization of cost recovery laws to get back the product and equipment used in response to replenish the team's supplies. Art indicated that up to \$3200.00 can be utilized for funding tier II software. Art stated lawsuits are being filed for civil rights violations, and there is no immunity. These lawsuits can be costly, so they encourage purchasing software that can assist in tier II.

Recommendation

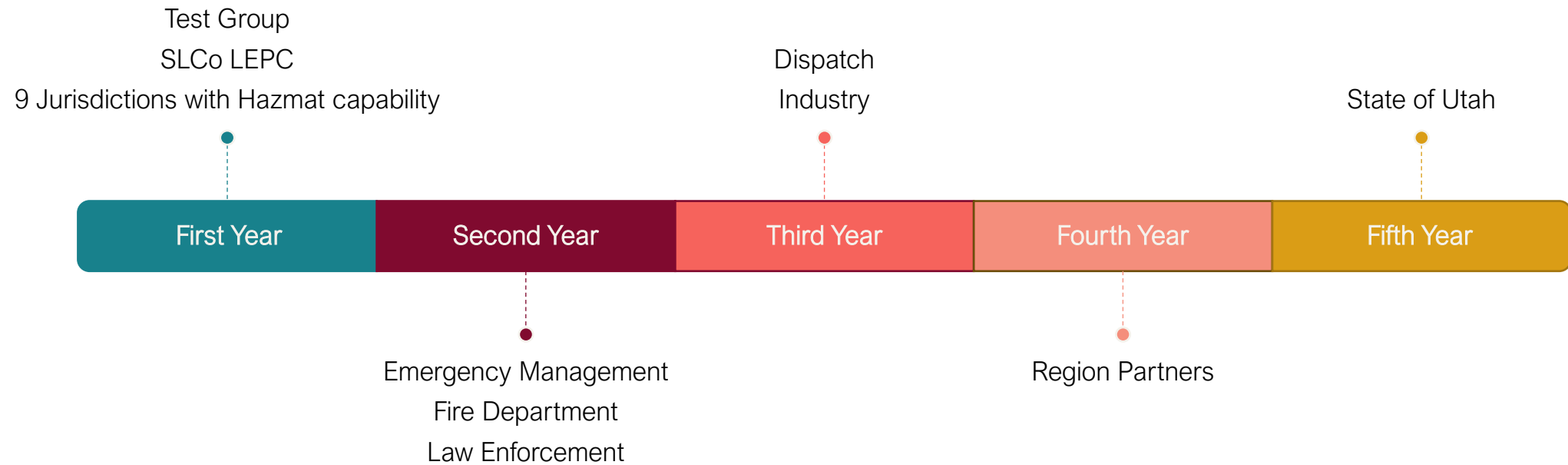
Tier II Subcommittee recommends PEAC software as a standardized county-wide solution to gathering and disseminating Tier II information.

This strategic five-year plan is a phased approach to ensure the allocation of resources for training and implementation. This phased approach will also provide an opportunity to leverage grant funding for the initial three years and then work to identify alternate sources to supplement or fund this software as it continues to roll out encompassing all stakeholders from Salt Lake County to State Partnerships.

- Incident Reporting

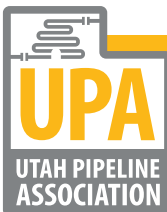
Summary

The Tier II subcommittee was tasked with identifying gaps and finding solutions for current Tier II reporting activities to ensure that the LEPC meets the objectives of EPCRA. The committee has spent the last year identifying gaps in the current Tier II process from reporting to response. Committee members have with several end users (Industry, Hazmat, Fire, and Law Enforcement) to understand how Tier II reports are submitted, disseminated, and used; the conclusion is that there is a need to provide a tool to build a more useful collaborative and integrated approach to how Tier II information is utilized. After carefully considering two software options, the subcommittee feels this approach will improve interoperability and coordination to save lives and property.

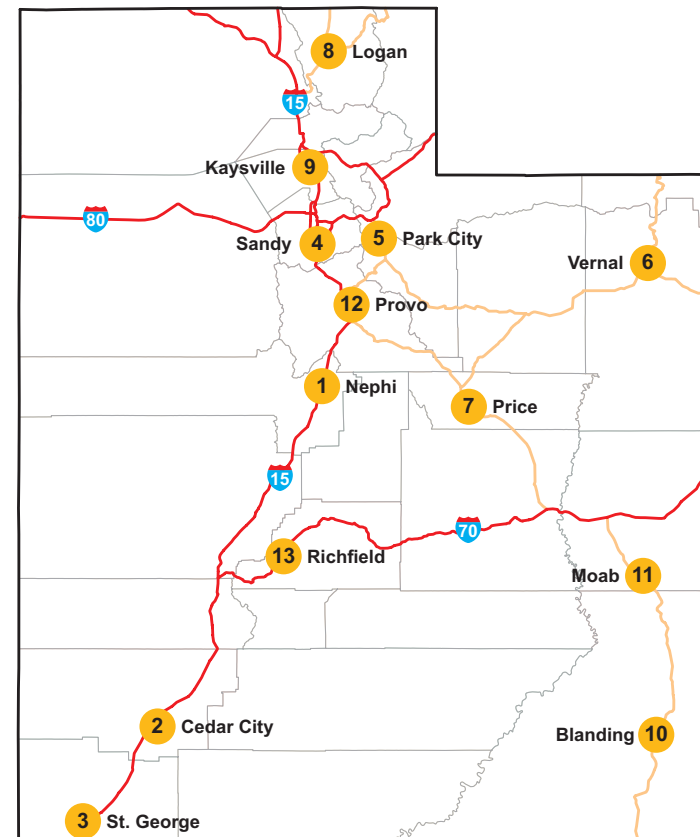
