- 1 By this policy, the Utah State Board of Education, "the Board," establishes the following
- 2 internal rules and procedures regarding Board member presentations to <u>legislative</u>
- committees or other meetings of the Utah State Legislature. [This policy shall apply to
- 4 all Board members, including the Board chair.]
- 5 1. The Board chair may invite a Board member to present to a legislative committee
- or other meeting of the Utah State Legislature [or other elected body] as an official
- 7 representative of the Board.
- 8 2. When presenting as an official representative of the Board, a [representing]
- 9 Board member shall advocate only for the official objectives and authority of the Board,
- 10 regardless of the [representing] Board member's personal opinions.
- 11 3. A representing Board member's [legislative] presentation shall:
- a. acknowledge that, in the specific instance, the Board member is the
- 13 Board's representative;
- b. state whether or not the Board has taken a position on the legislation or
- issue under consideration;
- 16 c. provide data and objective information related to the matter under
- 17 discussion;
- d. showcase <u>relevant</u> existing projects within the agency that <u>could</u>
- accomplish or support the general goals of legislators; and
- e. highlight Board administrative rules that accomplish or support the general
- 21 goals of legislators[;].
- 22 [f. state that the Board member is speaking [only] on behalf of the Board; and
- 23 g. state whether or not the Board has taken a position on the legislation

- 24 under consideration.]
- 25 4. Board members may enlist the assistance of staff in preparing materials and
- shall follow USBE style guides for written and visual materials submitted to the
- 27 Legislature.
- 5. <u>With the Board chair's permission</u>, Board members may develop their own
- 29 presentations[, with the Board chair's permission, but shall review the presentation with
- 30 the chair prior to the presentation].
- 31 6. The Board chair shall approve a Board member's final presentation. If time
- 32 permits, the Board chair shall consult with Board leadership and applicable standing
- 33 committee chairs.
- 34 7. Each Board member shall receive an informational summary of a representing
- 35 Board member's presentation within a reasonable time after the presentation. If the
- Board chair or vice chair is called up to testify without prior notice, each Board member
- 37 shall receive a summary of the testimony within a reasonable time after the
- 38 <u>presentation.</u>
- 39 8. An indvidual Board member may testify in a legislative meeting in the same
- 40 manner as any other member of the general public. However, when testifying as a
- 41 private citizen, a Board member shall clarify that the Boardmember's views are the
- 42 Boardmember's personal views or opinions and are not representative of the Board as
- 43 a whole.] that the Board member is appearing in a personal capacity and not speaking
- on behalf of the Board.
