



Additional Federal Award from ARP Act

ARP EANS (EANS II) – Emergency Assistance for Non-Public Schools

- USBE is serving as the fiscal agent for the award by the U.S. Department of Education
- The non-public school must meet or exceed 24% of total students in the school from households with a low-socioeconomic status
- USBE may not use ARP EANS funds to reimburse any non-public school as authorized under section 312(d)(4)(M) of the CRRSA Act





Conclusion of the CARES Funds

- September 30, 2022 end of ESSER I and GEER I grant period
- LEAs had until November 14th to request reimbursement of the funds
- Finalized numbers are due to the U.S. Department of Education on January 28, 2023

LEAs utilized these funds for:

- Salaries for educators, paraprofessionals, additional nurses and custodial staff
- PPE, social distancing, technology, and classroom supplies

State Reserve Projects

- Utah Principal Supervisor Academy: Program launched September 23rd with the first two cohort sessions. There are 67 principal supervisors enrolled in this effort.
- K-3 Professional Literacy (LETRS) Project: Completed Unit 3, while Unit 4 and 5 are underway. Unit 6 will be starting in November.
- Digital Access and Education Program: Continuing to collaborate with Utah Broadband Center and Governor's office on the statewide digital access plan. Feedback from other states that Utah is a leader in closing the digital divide.
- Scrible Contract: Continued training and support from UETN with over 34,550 users.
