  - Public comment
  - Chair will call for a vote, ask for any opposition or abstentions
  - Roll call only if it is non-unanimous, Liz will do roll call

#### Information from Rule 356-7

#### Member

One of 36 specifically outlined in UC 63M-7-301 15 can assign a Designee (indicated with D) 21 can assign a Representative (indicated with R) All can assign a Proxy

#### Designee

Counts towards quorum

Option only for indicated Members (must email USAAV+ staff)

Can attend electronically or in-person

Votes their conscience

Acts as Member until officially changed (unless Member attends) Can't assign a Proxy

#### Representative



Option only for indicated Members (must email USAAV+ staff) Can attend electronically or in-person

Counts towards quorum

Votes their conscience

Acts as Member until officially changed (even if Member attends) Can assign a Proxy

#### Proxy

Option for all Members and Reps (must email USAAV+ staff)

Must attend in-person

Counts towards quorum

Votes as directed by the Member or Representative Acts as Member for single meeting

- ▶ Bill positions
  - Support: Support to the bill
  - Support In Concept: Support but there's an area of concern
  - Oppose: Opposition to the bill
    - Will need an opposition statement
  - No Position: Neutral
  - Hold: Hold the bill for further information
    - Someone will need to follow up
  - Priority Support: Priority for passage
  - Beyond Scope: Not within the scope of the group's purview



- ▷ Bill priority
  - If there is a bill you would like to elevate, please let Liz (efklc@utah.gov) know prior to the meeting or let Liz know during the meeting



- ▷ Consent list for bill substitutes
  - We will be adopting this process from the Sentencing Commission. A consent list tab will be on the tracker that will include bills with non-substantive substitutes. This list will be made available on the tracker prior to Monday's meeting so that you will have time to review. We will call for one vote to carry over previous positions for all bills listed on this consent list. Anybody can request any of the bills to be removed from the consent list to be further discussed if needed

## CCJJ Bill Tracker / Report

- ▷ A list of bills tracked by CCJJ
  - Includes CCJJ position on each bill, AND
  - CCJJ-affiliated group's positions (if any), including USAAV+ Council
  - Available <u>here</u>
- A list of bills with the position of each group is distributed to legislators prior to legislative hearings



#### **USAAV+ Council Bill Tracker**

- A list of bills tracked by the USAAV+ Council
  - Includes current position (if any), notes on discussion, vote totals, etc
  - Available here
- Pulled from the CCJJ tracker but will not include everything
  - And may include some additional bills
- ▷ If you want a bill added to the tracker, ask Liz
- ▶ Will be updated at least weekly



#### Consent Items List

- A list of bills with suggested positions from staff
  - Limited to beyond scope / no position bills, or
  - New versions of bills we've considered with only minor changes
- Any council member may remove items from consent list by request, without discussion
  - Once list is final, we will take a motion and vote on the entire list

# Council Discussion vs. Public Comment

- Presentation
  - Anyone with expertise may describe / present a bill to the council
- Council discussion:
  - Council members will be given an opportunity to discuss the bill in advance of a vote
- Public comment
  - Members of the public will be given an opportunity to comment in advance of a vote

### **OPMA Processes - Generally**

- Notice of each meeting posted publicly
- Recording and minutes of each meeting posted publicly



## Voting Records

- - Will be done through the spreadsheet
- For non-unanimous votes, we must take a roll-call (UCA 52-4-207(9)



## USAAV+'s Vote on CCJJ



#### USAAV+'s Vote on CCJJ

- ▶ The Chair of the Council holds a seat on CCJJ
- ▶ If the chair cannot attend CCJJ, the Vice Chair shall represent us at CCJJ
  - If vice chair cannot attend, we may be able to send a delegate - but they must be a member of the USAAV+ Council
  - Proper notice must be given to CCJJ in advance of meeting



#### USAAV+'s Vote on CCJJ

- For bills up for vote at CCJJ where the USAAV+ Council has taken a position to support or oppose:
  - Chair's vote must reflect the Council's position
- For bills up for vote at CCJJ where the USAAV+ Council has not yet taken a position (or has taken no position or beyond scope):
  - Chair may exercise discretion to vote but will strive to honor the tenor of any discussion held at USAAV+ Council meetings, and the Council's values



# Director/Staff Responsibilities



## Director/Staff Responsibilities

- Maintain meeting minutes/agendas/running documents
- Make sure proper protocol is followed according to statutes and bylaws
- Communicate on behalf of the Council
  - Opposition statements
  - Testifying at committee meetings
  - Discussing issues with legislators / working groups
