- 1. A total of 153 eligible grant applications requesting \$1,121,133 from the City Arts Grants Program, which is funded by our Non-Departmental award, were received this fiscal year. In total, 87 applicants were awarded partial funds for their grant and thus we are unable to fund \$738,633 in request for our Non-Departmental Award. Unfunded applications equaled 66 applications or 43% of applicants.
- 2. Overall, no single applicant received 100% of their request, except for applicants of the Artist in the Classroom Grant Program (which is a full funding or zero funding structure).
- 3. We received applications from 34 new artists or organizations this fiscal year, 16 of these applications were awarded or are recommended to receive funds towards their project.
