Thanks to funding from DHHS, **Target River** is offering fifteen **\$5,000 mini-grants** to local community organizations across Utah. These grants aim to support outreach and engagement efforts within your communities, promoting the following:

- Enrollment in **Utah Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP).**
- Education and renewal support for enrolled members or members who have lost coverage during the national unwinding.
- Information about the new State CHIP program which offers limited enrollment for non-citizen children.





What Do Medicaid and CHIP Offer?



Utah Medicaid and CHIP offer free or low-cost health coverage for low-income Utah children. Children do better when they have quality health care -- they grow up stronger, ready to learn, and prepared to contribute to their communities.

Utah Medicaid and CHIP provide free or low-cost healthcare coverage for children of low-income Utah families. Quality healthcare helps children grow stronger, become better learners, and contribute positively to their communities.





Interested organizations will need to submit an application with the following details:

- Proposals on outreach tactics to reach families in your community
- Demonstration of need for your community
- Timeline for the campaign
- Proposed measurements to show effectiveness
