
2023 Annual Presentations

- Staff made 202 presentations to 5,572 people throughout 2023.
 - 70 presentations in county schools, including 12 elementary, 4 intermediate, 1 middle and 2 high schools in St George, Washington, Santa Clara, Ivins, Hurricane, La Verkin, and Springdale
 - 35 presentations to local students during field trips to the Tonaquint Nature Center
 - 31 presentations to groups in the new visitor center
 - 20 special events (including Tortoise Week, cleanups, and dedications)
 - 12 summer camp presentations
 - 10 guided hikes for school groups and events
 - 10 Storytime and Craft Days
 - 7 presentations to homeschool groups, private preschools, and youth treatment centers
 - 7 presentations to service organizations, HOAs, and special interest groups

Annual Education Center Numbers


- 17,531 people visited the Education Center during 2023! That is a 2145% increase from our 2022 visitation. By way of comparison, our best year on record in our old visitor center we had just 5,722 visitors.
 - Our ongoing collaboration with the Greater Zion Convention and Tourism Office has been a resounding success.
 - They have taken on the bulk of staffing responsibilities while we care for the animals and add display materials/brochures periodically.
- Sales revenue for Reserve merchandise totaled \$1,330 in 2023, with the majority of items purchased being maps.
 - We experimented w/ small selection of T-shirts and hats, and while the T-shirts sold periodically the hats were less popular.

Desert Tortoise Week 2022 (Oct. 3-7)

- About 300 residents and visitors participated across all events, with around 150 attendees at our biggest activity (the Tortoise Meet & Greet with Snow Canyon State Park)
- Initiated a cooperative partnership w/ the Natural Science Museum at Utah Tech University. Cross-promoted our respective citizen science programs with a "Night at the Museum"
- ½ acre of Zone 6 habitat weeded, raked, and seeded as a test plot for future reseeding efforts
- Our "Visitor Center Day" attracted 95 unique visitors to the new discovery center, despite conflicts with school schedules

Trail Stewards

- We currently have 31 active trail steward volunteers. Their efforts are invaluable in providing up to date observations on trail conditions, visitation and compliance with Reserve rules.
- In 2023, trail stewards donated a total of 1,559 hours monitoring, maintaining, and conducting visitor contact within the Reserve.
- Trail Stewards hiked **91** different trails within all 6 zones of the Reserve as well as Confluence Park.
- They recorded **12,057** encounters with hikers, bikers, runners, equestrians, and rock climbers during 2023.

Citizen Science

- In 2023, we collected 23 additional citizen science reports through our ArcGIS app.
 - The observations submitted were from across the county, but we did see some results from our efforts to target the eastern half of the county. We received a few reliable reports from Springdale and Hurricane Cliffs.
- This year we will update signage and engage partners in communities on the western side of the county, specifically at trailheads in Santa Clara, Bloomington, Ivins and Gunlock.
 - We'll also make citizen science a part of outreach presentations and explain the program to guests at the new visitor center.
