ACTION STEPS

Action Plan Steps and Expenditures

1. Identify tier one interventions related to school goals of AVID supports and higher level thinking. Examples of Tier one interventions include lower class sizes, support for MLL students utilizing highly qualified teachers, AVID strategies for all students, higher level thinking training and emphasis by all faculty. All students receive a rigorous class schedule during freshmen and sophomore years which leads to higher success through high school.

2. Identify tier two interventions to be strengthened for the benefit of students who need to participate. Examples of Tier two interventions/supports include Supervised Studies (credit recovery) classes, Techniques for Tough Times classes, AVID elective classes.

3. (Tier 2) Continue to employ a Transition Counselor to assist younger students to transition to high school and be known by a trusted adult during that critical time. 50% funded through LAND Trust.

4. (Tier 1) Continue to employ a counseling intern to assist in registration, success at East, and work with students to find pathways for their high school success.

5. (Tier 2) Help to support student advocates to mentor students and help to keep the hallways safe.

CALL REPORT

During the 23-24 school year, East High School will provide lower class sizes for Freshmen and Sophomores to better assist all students, including TSI identified groups, to achieve higher proficiency on end of year state tests. Class size will be set at 23-26 students per class. A newly adopted math curriculum will be implemented with math language routines embedded to gauge student progress and allow for reteaching. Implementation and PD for teachers will be provided for all math teachers from the district math team. 100% of math teachers will have PD opportunities. Math teachers will participate in summer and school year opportunities to write effective checkpoints which incorporate higher level thinking to inform reteaching strategies to impact student outcomes. A math teacher will be retained to provide AP and class size reduction for the math department.

Action Plan Steps and Expenditures

1. Math team will implement and get PD on new math curriculum adopted by the district.

2. Write effective checkpoints which incorporate qualitative and quantitative checkpoint data

3. Students will have math language checkpoints administered for periodic checks of student progress once a month incorporating higher level thinking.

- 4. Hire a math teacher to provide additional support for AP and Secondary math students.
- 5. Pay math teachers during the summer to write checkpoints and plan for departmental observations.

Student scores in ELA on EOY Aspire tests are lower.

9th grade scores were 41% and 23% over the last two years.

10th grade scores are 40% and 35%. Scores are targeted to see a 5% increase for the coming year. TSI targeted groups also have lower proficiency and need intervention to raise their proficiency.

The Growth Measure assessment will be helpful as we use the scores to guide instruction throughout the building.

We are targeting students for reading Support in 9th grade and in MLL groups.

4. USE AVID STRATEGIES IN ALL CLASSROOMS TO SUPPORT ALL STUDENTS.


