25 **1. CALL TO ORDER/INVOCATION/INSPIRATIONAL THOUGHT/PLEDGE OF**
26 **ALLEGIANCE**

27 Mayor Fullmer called the meeting to order at 5:35 PM. Councilmember Sifuentes gave the
28 invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.
29

30 Councilmember Cameron arrived at the meeting at 5:38 PM.
31

32 **2. WORK SESSION**

33 **2.1 Training**

34 City Attorney, Jayme Blakesley will train on the Open and Public Meetings Act, Ethics
35 Act, Roberts Rules of Order, and GRAMA.
36

37 Mr. Blakesley started the training with the Open and Public Meeting Act.

38 Councilmember Sifuentes asked if the minutes from a meeting had to be posted by a certain
39 time. Mr. Blakesley responded that there are two requirements, the audio of the meeting must be
40 posted within 3 days. He said that the draft minutes must be posted within one month.
41

42 Mr. Blakesley continued with his training.
43

44 Mayor Fullmer commented on special meetings that are not on the calendar would not be
45 considered an emergency meeting. She stated an example being if a meeting is not scheduled on
46 a specific date but decided to call one, that is a special meeting, not an emergency meeting.
47

48 Mr. Blakesley continued with his training.

49 Mayor Fullmer asked about posting on social media threads when other members of the
50 council are on the same thread. Mr. Blakesley responded to be careful and gave an example.
51

52 Mr. Blakesley continued with the Roberts Rules of Order and Ethics portion of his training.
53

54 **2.2 Municipal Code Amendment**

55 Public Works Director, Naseem Ghandour will present a code amendment for the
56 Prohibition of Exclusive Public Utilities Services within a Public Utilities Easement.

57 Public Works Director, Naseem Ghandour shared a presentation.
58

59 Councilmember Sifuentes asked if residents are protected in the law on the size of the utility
60 box placed on property and if council members can create any restrictions. Mr. Ghandour
61 responded, and a discussion ensued.

62 **2.3 Subdivision Ordinance Amendments**

63 Planner, Anthony Fletcher, will present code amendments for the Subdivision Code.

64 Planner, Anthony Fletcher shared a presentation showing the amendments to the
65 Subdivision Code.
66

67 Mayor Fullmer asked if all the changes made would bring them up to code. Mr. Fletcher
68 responded that that was correct.
69

70 Councilmember Sifuentes asked for clarification on making changes to both residential and
71 commercial even though it was not required for commercial. Mr. Fletcher responded that they
72 were doing so to be consistent. A discussion ensued.
73

74 Mr. Fletcher continued with the presentation.
75

76 Councilmember Holdaway asked if a Planning Commission Chair would be on the board for
77 the Development Review Committee (DRC). Community Development Director, Morgan Brim
78 responded that was correct, along with the department heads that dealt with land use and a
79 discussion ensued.
80

81 Mr. Fletcher continued with the presentation.
82

83 Mayor Fullmer commented on an item passed at a previous legislative session concerning
84 parking. She stated the public wanted a reduction in parking on their streets and explained how
85 the city met the new requirements and the concerns regarding that. A discussion ensued.
86

87 Mr. Fletcher continued with his presentation. He gave a recap and explained that since it
88 was a working session, a public hearing would be held during the Planning Commission and then
89 again during the next City Council meeting.
90

91 Councilmember Holdaway expressed his concerns about the timing of being noticed for the
92 work session. Mr. Blakesley explained the process of work sessions and a discussion ensued.
93

94 Resident Karen Cornelius expressed her concerns regarding notice timing. Mayor Fullmer
95 responded and explained the process of noticing for work session items and public hearings for
96 agenda items. A discussion ensued.
97

98 Mayor Fullmer recapped the meeting to that point and explained what would happen in
99 public comments and during the rest of the meeting.
100

101 **3. PUBLIC COMMENTS**

102 Mayor Fullmer opened public comments at 7:28 PM.
103

104 Resident Elizabeth Holdaway commented that she would like to petition that the hands
105 raised, during the meeting, in agreement with others should be counted and recorded. Ms.
106 Holdaway stated she would like more notice on agenda information.
107

108 Resident Jordan Christensen brought a book for each council member about parking. He
109 expressed his concern about parking regulations and management.
110

111 Resident Tyler Haroldsen, living in Edge Water expressed concern about pedestrians
112 crossing the road by the Megaplex and would like to see it changed to be a safer area for people
113 to cross the road.
114

115 Resident David Lauret thanked Mayor Fullmer and Mr. Blakesley for the work session that
116 they held. Mr. Lauret said he appreciated the intent behind bringing the discussion to the people.
117

118 Resident Keith Holdaway expressed appreciation for responses received to a questionnaire
119 he sent out. Mr. Holdaway commented that he would still like an answer regarding tax money
120 being returned to Megaplex and TopGolf.
121

122 Ms. Cornelius stated she would like an answer regarding the taxes being returned to
123 Megaplex and Topgolf to be on public record. Ms. Cornelius was thankful for the work session
124 and wants to work together for the common good. She expressed concern about an item on the
125 agenda from the December 27, 2023, City Council Meeting, East District Public Infrastructure
126 District, opening the door to the Inland Port Authority coming to Vineyard.
127

128 Resident Mike Cox expressed appreciation to former council member Tyce Flake for being
129 on top of the legislative process and would like to continue to be informed.
130

131 Mayor Fullmer closed public comment at 7:42 PM.
132

133 Mayor Fullmer responded to the comments and questions asked during public comment. A
134 discussion ensued between the council, Mayor Fullmer and Mr. Blakesley.
135

143 **6.1 Approval of the December 13, 2023, City Council Meeting Minutes**

144 **6.2 Approval of an Amendment to the ILA with Utah County for CTC (Resolution 2024-02)**

146 Mayor Fullmer asked if the council would like to continue the consent items to the next
147 meeting on January 24, 2024. Mr. Holdaway stated he would like to take the items off to discuss.
148

149 Councilmember Holdaway expressed concern regarding onboarding and the process so far.
150 Mayor Fullmer responded that each city has a different process and if the council was not
151 comfortable with approving the consent items, they could be continued to the next meeting. A
152 discussion ensued.
153

154 **Motion:** COUNCILMEMBER SIFUENTES MOVED TO CONTINUE THE CONSENT
155 ITEMS 6.1 AND 6.2 TO THE MEETING ON JANUARY 24, 2024. COUNCILMEMBER
156 RASMUSSEN SECONDED THE MOTION. MAYOR FULLMER, COUNCILMEMBERS
157 CAMERON, HOLDAWAY, RASMUSSEN, AND SIFUENTES VOTED YES. THE MOTION
158 CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

160 **7. BUSINESS ITEMS**

161 **7.1 PUBLIC HEARING Budget Amendment Resolution 2024-01**

162 City Manager, Eric Ellis, will present proposed amendments to the Fiscal Year 2023-
163 2024 Budget. The mayor and city council will act to adopt (or deny) this request by
164 resolution.
165

166 Mayor Fullmer called for a motion to open the public hearing.
167

168 **Motion:** COUNCILMEMBER SIFUENTES MOVED TO OPEN THE PUBLIC HEARING
169 AT 7:57 PM. COUNCILMEMBER RASMUSSEN SECONDED THE MOTION. MAYOR
170 FULLMER, COUNCILMEMBERS CAMERON, HOLDAWAY, RASMUSSEN, AND
171 SIFUENTES VOTED YES. THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.
172

173 City Manager, Eric Ellis presented budget amendments.
174

175 Resident Kim Cornelius asked for clarification about funds to hire a senior planner. Mr. Ellis
176 responded that when the quarterly report was completed it was found that they had the funds to
177 hire a senior planner or promote from within.
178

179 Mr. Christensen commented that he felt it was more cost effective to promote from within.
180

181 **Motion:** COUNCILMEMBER SIFUENTES MOVED TO CLOSE THE PUBLIC
182 HEARING AT 8:01 PM. COUNCILMEMBER RASMUSSEN SECONDED THE MOTION.
183 MAYOR FULLMER, COUNCILMEMBERS CAMERON, HOLDAWAY, RASMUSSEN,
184 AND SIFUENTES VOTED YES. THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.
185

186 Councilmember Cameron asked if more than one person was going to be hired or promoted
187 from within. Mr. Ellis responded that it would be one staff member receiving additional
188 certification and training for the new position promoted from within. A discussion ensued.
189

190 Councilmember Holdaway commented he would like to understand the departments before
191 voting on an item he does not understand. Mayor Fullmer asked Mr. Ellis if the item could wait
192 until after orientation. Mr. Brim responded that it could wait.
193

194 Mr. Blakesley called for a point of order. He stated that since the public hearing was closed,
195 only action on the item would be continued, not a public hearing. He said if the council wanted to
196 continue the public hearing, it would need to be part of the motion. A discussion ensued.
197

198 **Motion:** COUNCILMEMBER SIFUENTES MOVED TO CONTINUE 7.1 PUBLIC
199 HEARING BUSINESS ITEM BUDGET AMENDMENT RESOLUTION 2024-01 TO THE
200 MEETING ON JANUARY 24, 2024. COUNCILMEMBER HOLDAWAY SECONDED THE
201 MOTION. MAYOR FULLMER, COUNCILMEMBERS CAMERON, HOLDAWAY,
202 RASMUSSEN, AND SIFUENTES VOTED YES. THE MOTION CARRIED
203 UNANIMOUSLY.

207 Mayor Fullmer called for a motion to adjourn the meeting.

210 FULLMER, COUNCILMEMBERS HOLDAWAY, RASMUSSEN, SIFUENTES, AND
211 CAMERON VOTED YES. THE MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.
