It's been one year since, because of the accusations, deceit, and lies of Ray Golden, the commission gutted the sitting board of TUID and removed the town manager and installed their own people (with the exception of Mike Morlang). Now, with the promises of better things to come, ABSOLUTELUY NOTHING is better for the residents of Ticaboo. With the board comprised mostly of North Lake Powell (NLP) sympathizers, we are worse off than we were. It's my understanding that the building fund that we were accruing for an office space and shop, has been depleted, the reserve fund that is necessary for our bond requirements has been diminished, and all the assets (properties) have been sold. Now they want to sell the house that Chip lived in, leaving TUID nowhere to house any employees when the need arises. I strongly oppose that. I suggest that it would be in the best interest of the town if Amy Golden was removed from the board citing a conflict of interest, with her husband being the GM of NLP, as well as herself being an NLP employee. Board members, in my opinion, should be someone with a vested interest in Ticaboo.

NLP management has created a division in the residents in town. It's become a 'us against them situation' and that is not good for autonomy.

I would like to see a rate study before any rate increases are implemented. I am not opposed to paying a surcharge for the fuel but, I would like to make sure that it's necessary.

I believe that the county commission had good intentions when they made sweeping changes to the structure of TUID, it *certainly has not worked out that way*
