Pro-Term Mayor McGary said Okay, I believe we are live. And we'd like to excuse Mayor Scott O'Hare this night he's still on the road contending with traffic and road closures. So I will take care of conducting tonight, Rod McGarry. Mayor Pro-Term. And we also have Councilmember LuAnn Johnson and Councilmember Heather O'Hare Council, my role here is here. And, and also our staff, Stacey Hill and Tammie Morgan, and we appreciate them for being here. And we'll hear from them in a bit. I don't have anything to start with. So I guess we'll start off with a prayer and a pledge.

Tammie said We actually need to start with a public hearing.

Rod McGary said okay, I'm sorry. Sorry. Okay. All right.

Stacey Hill said It is posted. It's posted everywhere.

Rod said okay, that's not a problem.

Stacey Hill said There's two of them. There's the public hearing for the grant, and then the next one for the garbage.

Rod McGary Okay. So with everybody's assistance, we'll go ahead and start with a public meeting. And what is the first one that we'd like to do?

Tammie Morgan said It's just for the CDBG grant funds that we're going for. So it's the one that we're required to have. So the purpose of this public hearing is to provide citizens with pertinent information about the Community Development Block Grant Program and to allow

for discussion of possible applications for the 2024 funding cycle. The grant money must be spent on projects benefiting primarily low and moderate-income persons. The Bear River Association of Governments is expecting to receive approximately \$900,000. In this new program here. All eligible activities that can be accomplished under this program are identified in the CDBG application policies and procedure manual, and interested persons can review it at any time. Some of examples of eligible activities include the construction of public works, and facilities such as water and sewer lines, and Fire stations. Other examples of eligible activities also include the acquisition of real property and provisions of public services, such as food banks, or homeless shelters. In the past, Snowville has received funding for stormwater management improvements, emergency vehicle acquisition, and curb gutter and sidewalk installation. These activities are listed in the regional Consolidated Plan. This list shows which project Snowville has identified as being needed in the community. And then this is just a public hearing to see if anybody has ideas of what they would like to see the funds that were applying to be used for any questions or comments during the hearing, and you need to identify yourself by name before you speak. And then the clerk will need to include the names in the minutes. And then just so we know this is not to decide what we're doing. It's just for ideas. And no decisions will be made at this point in the meeting. So this is just to get community input. So if there's anybody, any citizens that have any comments are welcome to now. If not, we can move on.

Rod McGary said We kind of do have that earmark for something.

Tammie Morgan said Yeah, we do have ideas. And we do have our list of projects that need to be done in this town. There's the bridge that needs to be replaced. That's being condemned. Right? Is that what the word is? So we're looking into that. And then also, there are other

things that are on the list, but that's probably the most priority right now. So if there's no comment or anything, we can move on.

Rod McGary said Okay, looks like we're good to go. Thank you, Tammie. Okay, so we'd like to go on to the second public hearing.

Stacey Hill said so the second public hearing item is garbage. And last month we had Jason Lower's here from IDAWY and he said that they are increasing the rates on them. And so they are asking us to look at our rates too. And so we talked about that last month in the minutes. So the garbage rates are now \$27 for one can and they're gonna go up to \$30 for the first can, and on the second can, and \$7 After that, so I have it on the agenda. If you guys pass it, that's what it will be. And if we have any comments from the citizens, do you have anything to say about that? The rates going up on the garbage cans are \$3.

Rod McGary said Looks like we're good on that one as well. Everybody still wants their garbage picked up. So we're good. Okay, Appreciate that. Okay, with that, we'll close this portion of our meeting for the public to comment. And we'll start with the Public Town Council meeting then. Okay. Since Mayor Scott O'Hare is not here, I will take over doing the pledge. And then the prayer will be given by Stacey Hill.

Rod McGary Okay, thanks for that, like said, Mayor Scott O'Hare will be sworn, in at a later date, we still have some vacancies for Council members' seats. So if there's anybody that has some interest, or knows somebody that does, please get with the Council members. And let him give us those names. And we can move forward with that. Scott mentioned that he would like to submit a violation to our attorney and just wanted to let you guys know about that. And we can discuss it afterward. But that would be that he says he'll be moving forward on that. Just give you a heads up. Okay, landfill is the next item on the list. Currently, the landfill is closed. And we are currently the mayor is currently getting numbers from the current garbage agency to see what they can do on their end. And he says he doesn't have that information yet. And as soon as he does let us know, and we can

discuss it with a future council member. So as of right now, the landfill will still be closed until we make those decisions Okay. The next item is, as we had on the public hearing, the garbage rates for residential will be going from \$27 to \$30 for the first cans and \$7 thereafter. And we would like to make a motion to accept those.

LuAnn Johnson said I will make a motion that we raise the garbage rates from \$27 to \$30 and \$7. For the extra can.

Rod McGary said and Heather O'Hare seconds. All in favor? Opposed. Okay, just for the record. The reason that these are increased, these are increased costs passed on to us because of the garbage facility people and their operating costs have gone up. And so they've raised our costs, so we just pass that on accordingly. We don't make a profit on these types of things. It's just, we pass it on.

Rod McGary said Okay Box Elder County Sheriff.

Sergeant Eddington said Thank you for having me. I have the stats for the month of December in front of you. I don't have anything unless the counselors. Does anybody here have questions for me?

Rod McGary said Just like I kind of made the comment before I received the notice my wife actually had about domestic violence. And oh came on our phone. I was wondering, is that a common thing that they send out?

Sergeant Eddington said When you were telling me that I've never heard of that happening? So I don't know if it was a scam deal or what was going on. We don't know what time we would do send something out like that it'd be it come from our dispatch and reverse 911 type scenario where they would say we're dealing with a situation shelter in

place or we don't send messages out that we're dealing with a situation so I don't know where that came from. I would be interested to know what phone number it came from.

Rod McGary said I could ask my wife more on it, but just for public record of people getting that then maybe, you know, there might be something we might want to look at further and people are getting notices. And like I said if they're a scam or or if it is actually something that's been and disseminated to the public.

Sergeant Eddington said So yeah, we, I mean, we deal with a lot of scams in that way where people try to get money out of people, you know, but it was just a notice from what I understand.

Rod McGary said it was just a notice. All it said.

Sergeant Eddington said well, I'll get with you. And I'd like to know where that number is and see if that is a legit number.

Rod McGary said Okay, that sounds great. I appreciate that. Okay, any comments for the sheriff's department?

Sergeant Eddington said So starting next month, you'll have a new deputy representing Snowville I've taken on a different assignment with the sheriff's office, it'll take me away from being I'll still travel through the town every day, but I'm gonna be doing something else in the headquarters and Sheriff's Office.

Rod McGary said, "Do we have a name?"

Sergeant Eddington said I'm probably going to Sergeant Iverson, he's taken my position. And that I'll be working in town, but I'll still be traveling through. And if you hear of anything going on in town, you still have my cell phone number I come through here twice a day. That doesn't take effect till February 11. But I'll make sure that If it is Sergeant Iverson, I'll give them the contact information for the city.

Rod McGary said Thank you, we appreciate all that you've done for us to appreciate it.

Sergeant Eddington said Thank you.

Rod McGary said to Eric you're up.

Eric said thank you. I've got a bucket of water samples. Last year, where did you want it? Right when you want just on the ground or on the table.

Rod McGary said Thank you very much.

Eric said and then on the curb and gutter project out here in front Boyd never got a chance to give me a bid to come out and take care of things. So I think we're too far past the fall season beginning and now. Yeah, we'll just do this next spring. Boyd, he'll do a good job for us.

Rod McGary asked So what do you think? they'll give us a date or so?

Eric said I was expecting Mayish maybe. Yeah, you can kind of ride it out from there. And there's been a lot of discussion on the preliminary evaluation report on the water well out here, how you want to approach that. We looked for a well out here in the Northside of town as a geophysical investigation. So it's not it's not a low impact. We're not cutting holes in the ground, it's just more of a superficial investigation. So I used to use the same system for about the last 18 years. We've been 99% successful on location well, so had pretty good, that's kind of my thought anyway. So right now it's kind of the oldest.

Rod McGary said Okay.

Eric said and that's all I have anything for me.

Rod McGary said Right now, the Mayor's going to be going to the Mayor's Association to request some additional funding. And they would like to kind of earmark it for the flooding mitigation issues with Potter's Hollow. And also to see what you know, to put in a larger culvert for that, so you know what we're talking about there?

Eric said that the culvert was covered here and got the 48-inch replaced. Rod McGary said Yeah.

And then also, we've had issues with the water coming down the Dairy Road and then coming down Cemetery Road, you know, a lot of water. And so he would talk with him. He would like to see if there would be something that you would recommend that we can mitigate whether we redirect it. Some sort of covert type thing.

Eric asked, " Is it making it easy to make its way to South Road down here?"

Rod McGary said Oh, yeah. Oh, yeah.

Eric said Where it crosses over.

Rod McGary said Last year. Cemetery Road was closed because of it, there was a lot of water

LuAnn said it did damage as well.

Rod McGary said Yeah, it goes. This kind of swell, a little low area, just after the OSI area on the west side. And then it goes through the orchards and I'll come down through my property. And then from there, it goes out on Cemetery Road and then also from the top coming down from the Cemetery.

LuAnn Johnson said and then it was flooded right in front of you know, where the trailer park is.

Eric said Yeah.

LuAnn Johnson said That whole thing is just the lake.

Rod McGary said Yeah.

LuAnn Johnson said In the front of the homes.

Rod said Yeah, RV park. Yeah, it was. We had standing water there for quite a bit but like I said, the Cemetery Road was all under water. Eric asked Is it draining? To dig dehydration is what drains it's just too small.

Rod McGary said Well, what we'd like to see deserves a way that we could redirect it. So that it's not all coming down and being going through properties type things, you know whether we can do it through Bar ditch or the ditch, or whatever you need to do or redirect it somehow.

Eric asked Do you know, so much money, he asked him for that.

Rod McGary said He didn't say how much money he's going to be asking for. He said, First, he would like to maybe get a plan, and see what you have for some ideas. So one for the culvert replacement and also for the floodwater redirection. And see what, see what ideas you have, okay? You can talk to either LuAnn or myself, and we can kind of show you what has happened in the past.

Eric said Okay I will meet with him on a day and I have you kind of walk me through. We just redid this West End down here.

Rod McGary said So right, that part works, okay. The big problem is when the water comes down, it's a lot of water, it goes through my property and goes through my yard. And then on Cemetery Road, you know that it's all got to be closed down and stuff. It's really quite a bunch of damage and stuff. So if there's anything we can do to help mitigate that, redirect it, divert it somehow, or try and bring it down here. So it's not, you know, causing trouble like that.

Eric said So, yeah, I'll give you a shout like earlier in the day and walk me through it. So I have contour maps provided by liner loss and how we address how to do so.

Rod McGary said I pretty much everywhere the low spots. It's me. Well, our house is fine. It's coming to our backyard. We had about two feet of water last year.

Eric said Seriously.

Rod McGary said Yeah, it's been in my backyard.

Eric said Yeah, let me give you a better deal.

Rod McGary said for us to fix it. We had to cut the ditches. And then it goes out into the hay fields, and then it goes down to the RV park and on Cemetery Road, and then there's kind of a big flood.

Eric said So I think the funding to the FEMA takes some time and is a little more arduous to get the funding from them. Rural Water has some funding top, the Water Resources also has funding.

Rod McGary said Yeah, all those options are great. Appreciate that.

Eric said Anything else?

Rod McGary said Any other ideas?

Eric said Okay, awesome.

LuAnn Johnson said Thank you.

Rod McGary said Appreciate it.

Rod McGary Okay, the item I'm still we'll Fire department.

Dave Smith said Jed's is not here, but I can give a little bit. He and I have been talking. And then I'll just go into the EMS. Jed has been working on some radio stuff for us. You know, when we got the new Ambulance, the plant was in the old ambulance, we always had to have two radios in there because to communicate in Idaho, we had to use a completely separate radio with our new ambulance The plan was that we were getting the style radio and Jed understands this more with the old frequencies so that we could have Idaho

frequencies on that same radio. We worked with that and tried it and it's not, it's not being successful. And part of that is because Idaho is screwy. I think I don't fully understand all of it. But Idaho doesn't even use exactly the same stuff between counties which does not make sense to me but Jed's got a quote for some additional radios which would be one going in the ambulance and one going in the crash truck that would allow us them to communicate with Oneida County, the quotes \$2,594 That's for the two radios and that seems stalled. There are a few things that Jed was gonna follow up on but it is looking like that is probably what we're going to have to do to be able to communicate right now you know, we're still we've tried with the radio that's in the ambulance and tried to make that work, but we're just in success.

Rod McGary asked So is that the 800 megahertz frequency?

Dave Smith said This is actually still a UHF because that's what Oneida County uses. And the way I'm understanding that the radio that we have in the ambulance we can have the frequency and talk to Cassia County, but we can't talk to Oneida County and technically, when we're in Idaho, it's Oneida County that we need to talk to, but we are up there by the Cassia County border. You know, it helps to have both. And that's what's really kind of frustrating that between the counties and doesn't,

Rod McGary said isn't that also kind of when the Mine comes in? Isn't that gonna be another impact? Are they still in Oneida or Cassia County?

Dave Smith said Well, the Mine probably sits in Cassia. But it's right there on that edge, too.

Rod McGary said So, we now have the solution for all cases.

Dave Smith said Yeah, and that's what when I talked with Jed before he left, it's looking like this is probably the solution that we need to go with. And so, Jed, and I'll come up with how we propose. I mean, whether some of that comes from the Fire Department, obviously, some needs to come through EMS. Because we'd be putting it in the Ambulance. But it wasn't the route, we really wanted to go to have to have two radios in there, because that's always more confusing. But we do need to have communication. So just a heads up on that,

LuAnn asked if would Mine help pay for it.

Dave Smith Yeah, they possibly would, and that might be a good route to go to contact them.

Rod McGary said They did volunteer some money.

Dave Smith said So yeah.

Rod McGary said they did volunteer for that new ambulance at one time.

Dave Smith said yeah, we could look at them and see if they'd help out with that. Because, yeah, it would be a benefit to them, too. So yeah, we'll keep you updated on that. And then that was really the only thing I was aware of that Jed's been working on. As far as the EMS stuff FirstNet has still never got me actual pricing, like on the monthly plan. And I know we can't get Oh, you didn't?

Tammie said I forgot. What do we do for \$15? I mean, that's a little bit high on the month for Verizon.

Dave Smith said so we really just haven't had that good of luck with this First Net. I'd really like to be set up in February to have the iPad or tablet we're talking about. So I'm thinking based on what we're getting back that we probably just need to stick with Verizon and do it through what we've got set up with Verizon,

Rod McGary asked but it doesn't give FirstNet you kind of some advantages?

Dave Smith said. So the advantage to FirstNet is you're supposed to have a priority on the system. You know, that's their biggest claim to fame is priority on the system. We've just really struggled with getting much communication from them. And Stacey knows how long we've been between emails.

Stacey Hill said Yeah, Three months now.

Dave Smith said Yeah. Yes, been So I don't know. It just feels like they don't really want to work with you that much.

Rod McGary said Customer service is a big thing. So they can't support us.

Dave Smith asked does the county you guys run on that?

Sergeant Eddington said Half of our trucks were on it.

Dave Smith said so you have had good luck as far as there's.

Sergeant Eddington said there's a rep for the Sheriff's office, I could probably get that name, but he's an actual guy who we could probably call them on on his cell phone. He would answer. I can get it, I mean, the Verizon across from here to Park Valley is really awful. But the FirstNet, one of my deputies, has it in his truck. And he loves it. Just I don't know why it's better. I don't know why Verizon, their services went way downhill out West. I mean, so that's kind of what accounting started looking at FirstNet and put in half-part trucks. It's a trial thing. And it sounds like they're probably going to move them all to it. I'll make a note and I'll get the contact number.

Dave Smith said that right now all they have is the guy that's emailed us. And I emailed him back, asking for some more information. The only information they really give us is pricing on the iPads or tablets, which I mean is helpful. But I mean, we're looking at what's the total cost, you know, and compared to what we're already doing with Verizon.

Sergeant Eddington said So I'll text our IP guy right now. To see if I can give him before the end of the meeting.

Rod McGary said Excellent. That'd be wonderful. Appreciate that.

Dave Smith said That would be helpful. And then as far as our EMT classes that have been going on we've got Garrett and Carson both have started their class Monday. I think they're back in class. So they're doing that class in Garland. Iesha Velasco last week, or last month I talked about her doing an intermediate class, and I wasn't sure about the payment. We were at the hospital and we talked with Sam, she said that it is free, but they have not asked if she has registered, and they haven't asked for payment. So I think maybe we're getting the right answer there. Because she's set to start class. I think tonight may have been her first night in class. So I think that is going to work out where it doesn't cost us the money. We've gotten those three, working on EMT classes.

Rod McGary asked So are you feeling comfortable with the staffing that you have, number-wise, or what?

Dave Smith said Yeah, I mean, it's very helpful, Iesha being an intermediate will be helpful for us. Garrett and Carson have been helping out a bunch, you know, from the Fireside. So we've already been utilizing them a lot to help us. So it'll be good to have that, you know, the training, backing up for them to cover a little more bases for

us. But all in all, it's been working pretty well for us. So that's all that I have. Do you guys have any questions or anything?

Rod McGary said Okay, thank you. Okay, Snowville Clerk, the CDBG grant, was talked about, are there meeting the grant applications on the 31st? So January, so I just started the application just trying to get some final numbers.

Rod McGary said They're not gonna change the date on us.

Tammie Morgan said No, I had to read this public hearing because it wasn't. I didn't put it in the newspaper. It was supposed to be in the last week of December. But apparently, they don't have the paper. But they told me they were going to and so we had to repost it. And so we've got everything covered. So I think we're Good.

Rod McGary said So there's nothing that we're outstanding on that we need to do.

Tammie Morgan said so to get that deadline. Before the 31st.

Rod McGary said So excellent. So is there anything that you need from us?

Tammie Morgan said No, I might be getting with Luann a little bit too. And I can't get a hold of it for the tip of my tongue so maybe Eric knows. Who's the guy that helps Rebecca Nicks?

Stacey Hill said it is in the minute, somewhere. I know it is. It has to be.

LuAnn Johnson said it was Nicolas.

Rod McGary asked LuAnn Do you have that on your phone then?

LuAnn Johnson said I could have possibly deleted the messages because we are done with that portion

of it. So I don't keep them on my phone.

Stacey Hill said I'm sure we can find it.

Rod McGary asked Tammie if she was doing a search?

Tammie Morgan said I'm looking into the email. Okay, Nicholas. I got it. I found his email. It just says, Nicholas. But I have his email.

Stacey Hill said she found it.

Rod McGary said Cool. Thank you. Okay. Snowville Treasurer. So once again, it's the opening and closing of the new meetings over. fraud risk assessment thing again, we'll send the link to your guys. And I'm happy to do that. And then have you send it back to Me?

Rod McGary said it's already been a year.

Stacey Hill said Yes. Every January? Yeah. It's one of our things on our audit. If I remember Matt Jensen, saying that. So yeah, we have to make sure we have to get back.

Tammie Morgan said I can send the link again. Because I sent that link to your emails that you just had to click on. Yes. Yeah. I'll send that link out to all of us. This will take care of half a minute to do that.

That'd be great. And you want your certificate ticket back? Absolutely.

Rod McGary said all right.

Stacey Hill said That's all I have.

Rod McGary said Thank you. AJ Morgan water.

So it's that time of the year again, to go to St. George as I normally do every year to stay certified with Rural Water to be the water operator. So that will be coming up at the end of February, and Tammie will get that all set up. So you guys are aware of that. Also, we've run into a slight dilemma. Scott Page has been helping me with the water

operator. Three years ago, Scott went with me down to be certified. Scott was unable to pass the test at that time. He kept telling me he was going to go and take the test again. He has never gone back. I had a good visit with Scott the other day, at this point and Scott's life right now. He's working in Salt Lake and being in His Church calling Scott does not have the time to do it. So I would like to suggest to you guys that I take Kyler Morgan with me to St. George to be certified. Kyler does not do EMS, he doesn't want to do EMS. So he says, that would be a way he can be involved and help the town, his younger generation, that's what I liked about it, some, it's eventually gonna take this over. And he's always with me anyway, he probably knows the system, other than me probably as much as anybody other than Tim Heyder. So I propose that I take Kyler with me to get certified to be the new water operator when I go into February, but that's up to you guys, whatever you guys want. So Scott said that he would still be willing to help. And he may go back when he gets done with his other church thing when he has more time to be certified. And it doesn't, we can have as many certified the more we have certified, the better it is anyway. And he said he's still willing to help me. But he's, he can't commit to do what I actually need him to do. And he's never here anymore. Anyway, So if you guys were alright with that. There are still some openings that we can get him enrolled in. And he would just go on a date for me and have a test the day after me why we're there anyway. So it's really not going to be any more costly to the town. Because Scott would be going anyway if he was going.

LuAnn said it sounds good to me.

Tammie Morgan said I think that we just, I think he's a good qualified candidate. I think we just need to post it. And if there's anybody else, we just need to make sure, if anybody else is interested, is more qualified, whatever. You know, just to cover our bases

LuAnn Johnson asked, "But if you just post it for two weeks, will you have enough time to make the arrangements in February?"

Tammie Morgan said Yeah. It's the end of February, the test has to be. I called them to make sure there was room for somebody to take the test. So there is and they know we're going to be sending a new person. So it has to be done by February 11. I just don't want any, you know, saying anything.

Rod McGary said it sounds good.

Tammie Morgan said then if nobody or if people do apply, we can see who has more qualifications or whatever.

Rod McGary Okay. Sounds good.

LuAnn Johnson said Sounds good.

AJ Morgan said Also Dennis from Rural Water, I didn't get Dennis's last name. Eric, if you know who he is?

Stacey Hill said he got his card in, I think it was Quinn. He was funny and a really cool guy.

AJ Morgan said the conference we go to in St. George is actually sponsored by Rural Water anyway. But Dennis reached out, he actually stopped here last week, and I visited with him down here in the parking lot for a half hour. So he's, he's willing, he's trying to help where he can help out. I don't know how much as far as the waterside or whatever, but he has some ideas for Rural water, possibly. There's money available for the sewer system. If you're thinking about going that direction, it is kind of what he suggested his specialty was anyway with what he's doing with Rural Water. Anyway, long story short, he would like to maybe next month, and he'll get with me before Town Council, an hour before Town Council comes, and sit down with all you guys and kind of just have a talk around the table and throw some

ideas out to see where Rural Water can help Snowville. And if something works, it works. If it doesn't, then we can pick his brain. So he said he'd reach out to me and I'll get it put on the agenda or like you guys know if that happens next month? Sure. Sounds good. Thank you. So other than that, I think that everything else is going well.

Rod McGary said appreciate that. Thank you. Okay. My item for flood mitigation though we weren't discussing that. Unless there are any other ideas from the town that have some things that you'd like to see happening. When we have the springtime run-off. In that, we'll go on to LuAnn Johnson. Do you have any comments tonight?

LuAnn Johnson said No, it's just the stuff that Heather's gonna talk about.

Stacey Hill said There's one more Heather.

Rod McGary said Yeah, she's next after.

LuAnn Johnson said Yeah. So I'll just join in with Heather on that.

Rod McGary said Okay. All right, we'll turn time over to you guys.

Heather O'Hare said So what was it?

LuAnn Johnson said that the rule for a Cemetery plot is, if you're in the city limits, it's \$200, if you're outside of the city limits is \$400. I just have a question for people who have lived here their whole life. Why did we have to charge them \$400 When they lived here and participated in our town for years and years and years? Is there a reason behind that?

Tammie Morgan said It was just something they set up. And it's actually so \$200. If you're in the city limits, it says they're still paying

taxes or whatever. If you live in like Stone area, like outside, you know, local area, what do you call the valley? That it's \$400. And then it's \$600 for anyone, or the farmer that doesn't live within the valley? And that's, I mean, if you guys want to make that change, that's up to you.

LuAnn Johnson said excluding Stone if they're outside the city limits going either direction. Whichever direction is there and their address is still Snowville Utah, do they pay? Snowville Utah taxes?

Tammie Morgan said It goes to the county, so they don't pay any taxes, or only the people who live in the city limits pay the Snowville taxes. And that was the reasoning. But you guys can look at that if you want to change it.

Rod McGary said there is an option for those types of people to if they want they can request annexation, can they not?

Tammie Morgan said So it's like the people in the town are paying the taxes. That's true. No, that was what the discussion on those rates was like.

Eric said That's pretty standard, too.

LuAnn Johnson said I just wondered because he just lives down the road. And, man, you know, it just didn't seem right to me. Then I thought, well, that's not right, because they have lived here forever.

Tammie Morgan said Could put an exception in there. If you lived in the valley longer than 20 years or so. I don't know, whatever. Do that to you guys.

Colleen Hansen said my uncle was a mortician in Brigham and his family lived in Brigham and he moved to Logan. And he came back to

Brigham. It was \$600 to \$1500 for the plot and \$600 to open and close the grave. It's what they do to keep it functioning.

LuAnn said well and the upkeep on it and all that. Yeah. So I sat with that for a little bit longer. I thought that it was already on the agenda.

Tammie Morgan said that was a good question and it's good to be addressed. So people know we know.

Stacey Hill said you're newer too and then you didn't know about either.

Rod McGary said Yeah, that's good, FYI. Okay, we now have an option for public comment. If anybody from the town wishes to address the council, they're welcome to take the floor for a couple of minutes and if they do, please come up to the front and state your name and your topic and we'd love to hear from you and we'll take notes and comments and go from there.

Jim Beagley said and since you said you would love to hear from this My name is Jim Beagley. Okay, and I was just wondering about the stop sign right here. The lights have been blinking on that one for a good three months.

Rod McGary said Okay.

Jim Beagley said It couldn't be in a month's warranty. Do not want to check into that.

LuAnn Johnson said Oh, coming into town or on the other side. I noticed that Okay. So we need to call on that right?

Jim Beagley said yeah. I always got wrecked again. Some guy ran the light.

LuAnn Johnson said They're still doing that.

Rod McGary said Yeah,

Jim Beagley said they think it's a four-way stop.

Rod McGary said and so they go through because you're gonna stop right?

Jim Beagley said I was slowing up because you know he was coming down. And so he started going through and so I stepped on the brakes and stuff like that and he's going like this and four-way stops Yeah, I got a little out of control. I yelled out my window and told him that he was a dumbass. It wasn't a 4-way stop. I'm sorry, but that's about the seventh time that I've almost gotten into a wreck right there.

Rod McGary said I don't know. Is there anything we put up there and say that this is not a four-way stop?

Jim Beagley said They have signs.

LuAnn Johnson said then all four of them are gonna run the stop sign.

Jim Beagley said They have signs saying it's a four-way stop or two-way stop.

Eric said they have signs that say cross chatter.

Rod McGary said Yeah, maybe you should. You know, we have talked about that at one time. Turning into a four-way but yeah.

Rod McGary said Okay, any other comments? Okay, I guess our next thing is expenses. Like that.

Stacey Hill said It was the same one.

LuAnn Johnson said What are the question marks? That's the only one. That's the only question I had. There were question marks. Oh, they disappeared just to fix it. In the real question marks underneath something.

What on my phone is the one that you sent to my phone? There were like four question marks under one of these.

Stacey Hill Oh, really? I had no idea.

LuAnn Johnson said That was the only question. I was probably just doodling or something

Rod McGary said I saw it but I didn't actually look at it. Because I knew I'd be looking at here. So were there any adjustments?

Stacey Hill said So there are cuz you said you didn't have your stuff. Yeah, yeah, I'll have my site and then Nate Spackman. And so Verizon. And then I just barely got Rocky Mountain Power came today and the Frontier and Fuel Network. So those are the ones and then Ches Burmester I have to refund him some money. So yeah, cuz I overcharged him on a business license. So we'll get that taken care of. So those are the only additions that I have.

LuAnn Johnson said to make the motion that we accept the expenses, with the addition that Stacey mentioned. Heather O'Hare seconded it. Rod McGary said all in favor, aye. Aye. Anybody opposed? Okay. Expenses are approved. Okay, that covers everything this evening. We appreciate you all coming and if you have any comments or

anything else, feel free to reach out to us and we appreciate your attendance. Thank you very much we are Adjourned.
