Wasatch High School Principal Justin Kelly, joined by WHS Assistant Principals Tara Jarvie & Amanda Edwards, led the discussion re: possible name for the new high school of "Deer Creek High," with "Mountaineers" as the mascot, and "Lake Blue" and "Silver Mine" as the colors. Superintendent Sweat: "I just want this on the record as we start that, what the board has requested for tonight is that Principal Kelly, as the chair of the naming committee that's been working on this for several months, that tonight they present a name and colors and a mascot for the board's consideration. So we are not naming the high school tonight and we realize that message may get a little confused as it goes out into the community, but we feel like it's a good process. The board has requested that you come tonight and that it's presented in this way, but we would just clarify for those people online and everyone else within earshot that this is going to be our first blush at a name with the accompanying mascot and colors for consideration. It's not on the agenda for the regular meeting."r **Principal Kelly** shared the process the naming committee went through in terms of considerations for the name,

Principal Kelly shared the process the naming committee went through in terms of considerations for the name, mascot and theme, and gave a history of Deer Creek Reservoir, which started in 1936, and is the confluence of the Provo River, Snake and Spring creeks, just like the students will come to the school from across the area it serves. "So what we'd like to propose to the school board today is we'd like to call it Deer Creek High School. And our legacy is built on our values. They've been constant and will remain long after we have all moved on."

Discussion 2. School Board Compensation Schedule Discussion

Business Administrator Jason Watt began his presentation by explaining there has not been an increase in School Board compensation for at least 40 years, and enumerated the many ways the Board spends hours on business and constituent issues. He proposed to increase the board monthly stipend to \$1,150 per month with board leadership receiving an additional \$150 per month for the additional services they render. The proposed compensation schedule will be discussed at the following Public Hearing and voted on at that point.

2. Public comments will be accepted. Each speaker will be allowed a maximum of two (2) minutes.Machele Smith of the Wasatch Education Association and former WCSD Business Administrator Keith Johanssen both expressed support for the proposed compensation schedule.

Business Administrator Jason Watt explained the impetus for the compensation update: "The Board currently receives \$250 per month for compensation for their time. And they put in significant time not only in meetings here, but in committee assignments and meetings in state-level assignments and working with constituents and other district committees. It's a significant amount of time. They receive \$250 a month for that and \$100 a month for travel stipend totaling \$350 a month, which is as low as anybody in the state. And so in an effort to keep them more similar to other

school districts and also other political entities in our community, we are proposing for the board to consider an increase in their stipend to \$1,150 per month. In addition to that board leadership for their roles as president and vice president would receive an additional \$150 per month. Also, board members on significant committee and state assignments such as the USBA board of directors or other similar type assignments as approved by the board would receive an additional \$150 per month for their services as is the case now, the board members also receive a funded insurance plan for them and their family."

H. Superintendent Report

Superintendent Sweat announced that Old Mill Elementary School has been named the #5 elementary in Utah by U.S. News and World Report. He presented a plaque to current Old Mill Elementary Principal LaNay King, and invited former OME Principal Stephanie Discher to join them for a photo.

Superintendent Sweat: "There are 749 public elementary schools in the state of Utah, about 50 are private, and of those 750 plus (public) elementary schools, based on certain achievement metrics and some other things that they include ... Old Mill Elementary is ranked fifth out of almost 800 schools in the State of Utah. I should mention that all of our elementary schools fared very well in this report. In fact, Midway Elementary was close behind and I think they're right near the top 20. They didn't send us a plaque, but we'll recognize them in other ways. And all of our elementary schools are in a very good position on that list, so we give a shout out to all of our schools, but specifically to Old Mill tonight."
