- 2020 Census data shows 65.56% of PSA residents are white, 29.44% Latino, 6.39% Asian/Pacific Islander
- Kearns township itself is 49% white and 51% minority
- 13.3% of youth are at or below poverty level
- Among highest PC utilization in the County Library
- 9.03% Persons with Disabilities
- 13.69% of adults over age 25 have not yet earned a HS diploma or equivalent
- Approximately 60-75 tweens/teens daily after school
- Families with young children
- Single adults
- Low-income and/or unhoused individuals

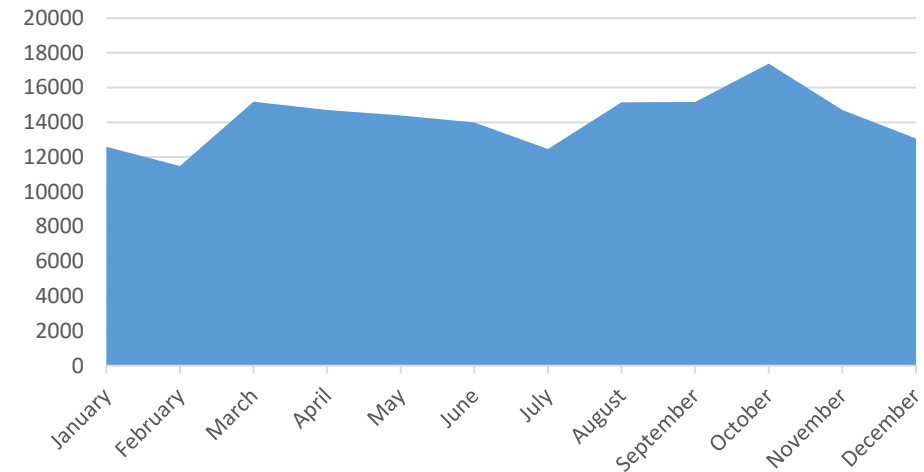

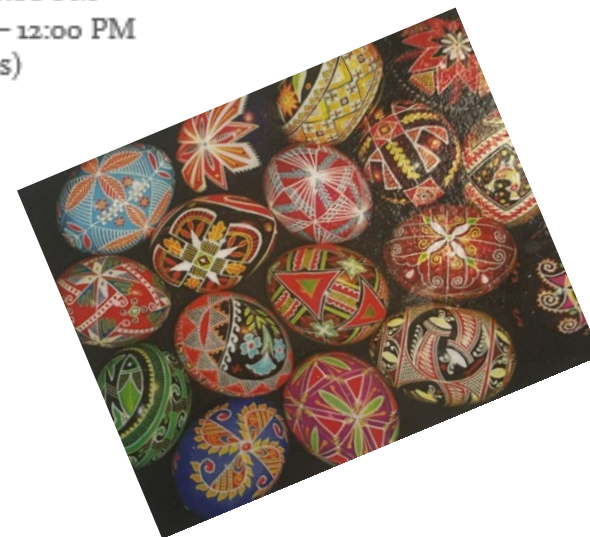

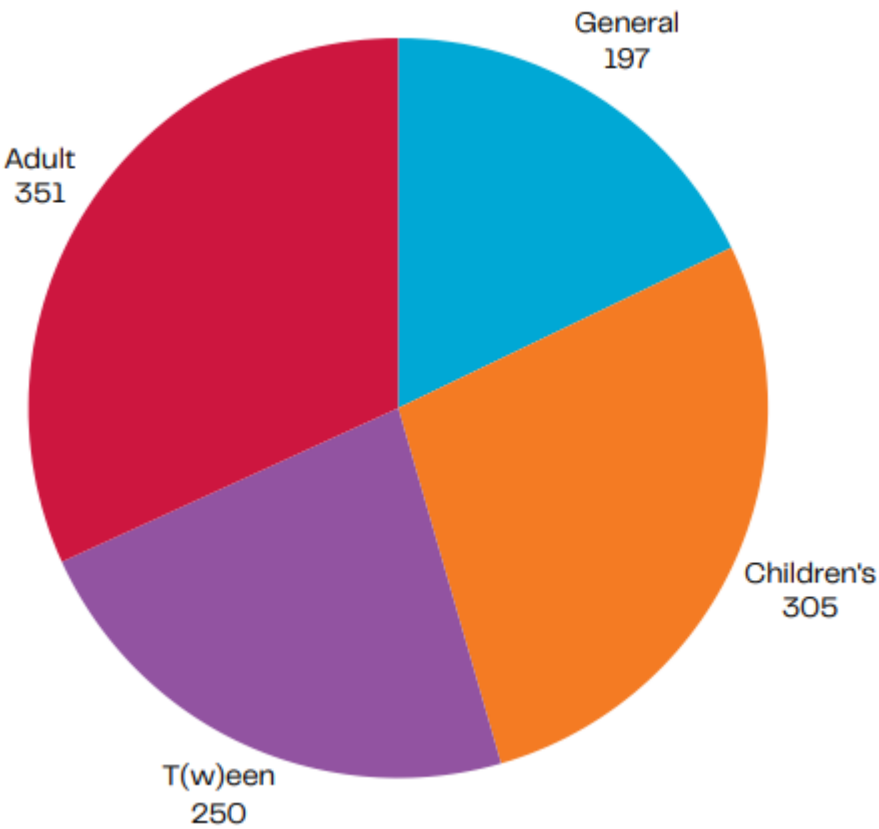
2023 PROGRAM STATISTICS

Kearns Library offered **1,449 programs** for patrons in 2023. Total attendance for these programs was 48,652.

The top attended programs in 2023 were:

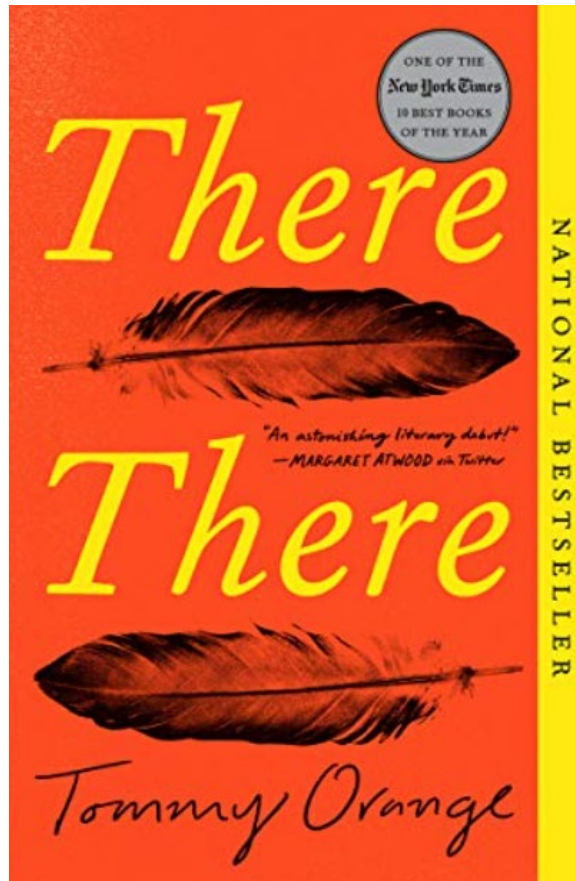

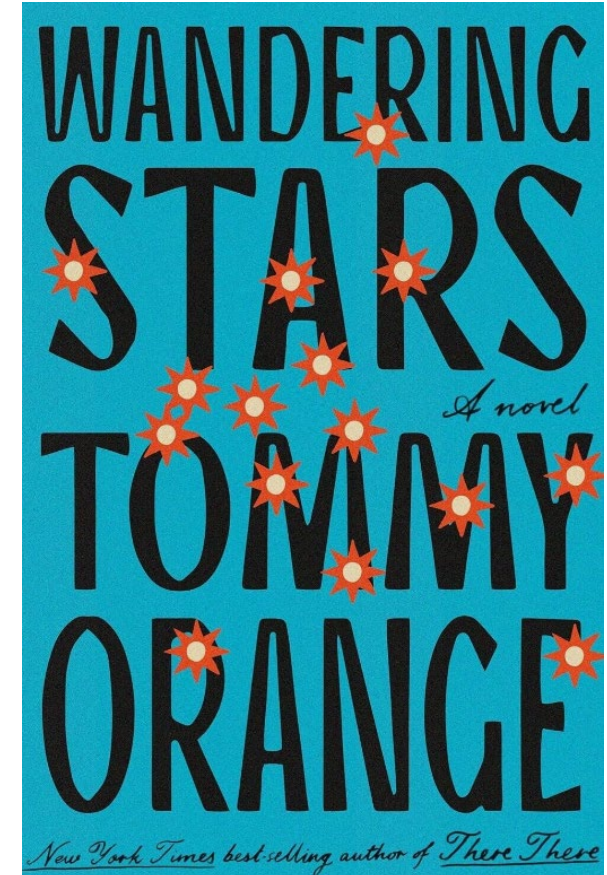
