**A RESOLUTION OF TOWN OF BRIGHTON COUNCIL  
DETERMINING TOWN OF BRIGHTON'S CHOICE FOR  
POLICING**

**WHEREAS**, during the 2023 State Legislative process H.B. 374 passed which requires a separation of the Salt Lake County Sheriff from the Unified Police Department ("UPD"), and

**WHEREAS**, UPD has been providing policing services to the Town since its inception, and

**WHEREAS**, as a result of that separation it has become necessary for UPD to amend and restate the interlocal agreement under which it was created, which restated and amended interlocal agreement will govern the provision of law enforcement services to its members, and

**WHEREAS**, both the Sheriff's office and UPD has made presentations to the Town of Brighton Council during a duly noticed public meeting, and

**WHEREAS**, having now considered the presentations made, and to meet Town of Brighton 's law enforcement needs, Town of Brighton affirm its commitment to the UPD.

**NOW THEREFORE IT IS RESOLVED**, by the Town of Brighton Council,

**1.** The Town of Brighton Council hereby instructs the Town Attorney and staff, to finalize the drafting of the restated and amended interlocal agreement for the Unified Police Department, with Town of Brighton as a member thereof, and

**2.** Upon approval by the Unified Police Department's Board of the completed restated and amended interlocal agreement for the Unified Police Department, to present said agreement to the Town of Brighton Council for review and adoption.
