### Senate Bill 220 - School Readiness Amendments

DWS SR Board Staff – Megan Vlaming

Senate Bill 220 dissolves the School Readiness Board and departmentalizes the work overseen by the Board.

- Effective July 1, 2024
- Eligibility language change
- Multi-year Expanded Student Access grants
- USBE Board will determine the official assessment tool to determine student progress

### School Readiness Grant Application Process

- DWS, OCC and USBE have worked together to create the application & rubric.
- Pre-proposal meeting
- Live Q&A page
- Applicants were required to submit all documents by the deadline noted in the RFGA, pre-proposal meeting and the live Q&A
- DWS, TCCU & USBE Evaluation Committee
  - Blind review



### **Expanded Student Access Grant Applications**

- 23 returning grantee applications
  - 20 grantees have been on since 2022
  - 3 grantees started in 2023
  - 1 returning grantee application did not meet the scoring threshold
- 11 new grantee applications
  - 8 met the scoring threshold
  - 3 applicants did not meet the scoring threshold



### **Scoring Process (with split)**

#### **ESA New Applicants**

Total Application Score: 383 points

PEEP Assessment (40%): 153 points

Narrative (30%): 115 points

ECERS-3 Score (30%): 115 points

Scoring Threshold (60% of total score): 229.8 points

#### **ESA Returning Applicants**

Total Application Score: 300 points

PEEP Assessment (40%): 120 points

Narrative (30%): 90 points

ECERS-3 Score (30%): 90 points

Scoring Threshold (60% of total score): 180 points

### **Becoming High-Quality Grant Application Process**

- 11 BHQ Grantees entering the second or third year of their contract
- 19 New BHQ applications submitted
  - 14 applicants met the scoring threshold
  - 5 applicants did not meet the scoring threshold
- Main Application
  - Minimum threshold requirement: 72/120 points

SY 25 Budget Scenarios

Code: Subject to legislative appropriations, the board shall give first priority in awarding grants to a respondent that has previously received a grant under this [ESA] section if the respondent: (a) makes the annual report described in Subsection 7(b); (b) participates in the evaluation; and (c) continues to offer a high quality school readiness program as determined during an annual site visit by: the State Board of Education, for an eligible LEA; or the department, for an eligible private provider.

### Scenario 1

Number of ESA Seats: 1709 Number of BHQ Classrooms: 51

- Funds all returning ESA grantees from the 23/24 SY
- Reduces the current number of Eligible Student Seats each applicant is serving by 15%.
- Additional Costs requests include fingerprinting/background checks and coaching services
- Adds two new ESA grantees with all requested additional costs
- Adds three new BHQ classrooms

#### **Funding Breakdown**

- ESA Returning: \$9,965,034.51
- ESA New: \$504,406.12
- BHQ Returning: \$1,440,000.00
- New BHQ: \$90,000.00
- Total Spent: \$11,999,440.63
- Remaining Funds: \$559.37



### Scenario 2

Number of ESA Seats: 1930 Number of BHQ Classrooms: 55

- Funds all returning ESA grantees from the 23/24 SY
- Keeps the current Eligible Seats from SY23-24
- The cost per seat is averaged based on LEA or Private provider, based loosely on the NIEER averages
- Additional costs are only allowed if the total remains under the cost per seat total
- Adds one new ESA grantee
- Adds seven new BHQ classrooms

#### **Funding Breakdown**

- ESA Returning: \$10,226,760.34
- ESA New: \$116,851.50
- BHQ Returning: \$1,440,000.00
- New BHQ: \$210,000.00
- Total Spent: \$11,993,611.84
- Remaining Funds: \$6,388.16



### Scenario 3

Number of ESA Seats: 1980 Number of BHQ Classrooms: 56

- Funds all returning ESA grantees from the 23/24 SY
- Reduces the current number of returning ESA grantee seats by 25%
- Adds 8 new ESA grantees (all grantees that met scoring threshold)
  - o reduces new ESA grantee seats by 50%
- The cost per seat is averaged based on LEA or Private provider, based loosely on the NIEER averages
- Additional costs are only allowed if the total remains under the cost per seat total
- Adds eight new BHQ classrooms

#### **Funding Breakdown**

- ESA Returning: \$7,702,068.59
- ESA New: \$2,609,507.11
- BHQ Returning: \$1,440,000.00
- New BHQ: \$240,000
- Total Spent: \$11,991,575.70
- Remaining Funds: \$8,424.30
