





UCSS stewards have been trained to follow specific protocols when they encounter damages, vandalism, looting, or theft. EllenMae is an awesome steward who monitors a number of sites, one of which was recently vandalized. On her initial site visit with a UCSS team member, they came across recent vandalism. Because of their decisive action, local land management and law enforcement were able to get involved and the perpetrators charged; litigation is currently underway. Stewards provide land managers with an additional set of eyes on the ground and we can't thank those like EllenMae enough for what they do. 



