- 1) ***Work Session (pre-application) regarding a Master Planned Development for Outlets Park City, an 18-building mixed use redevelopment project located at 6699 N Landmark Dr (Parcel FSE-1), Kimball Junction, Summit County, UT. The applicant is proposing to Rezone Parcel FSE-1 from the Town Center Zone to the Neighborhood Mixed-Use 1 (NMU-1) Zone. Parcel FSE-1 (37.32 acres); Applicant: Elliott Workgroup (Sid Ostergaard), representing SRE Ontario LLC; Project #PRE-APPLICATION; Administrative and Legislative Review.
