Mr. Terrance Bell addressed the council and those in attendance. He wished to withdraw his name from being considered to run for City Council. He is currently on the Planning and Zoning community and feels that is where he can best serve the City of Ferron.

Mr. Clifford Snow addressed the council and those in attendance. He stated that he had lived in Ferron almost his whole life. He had served previously on the City Council. Mr. Snow had many ideas on how he could help the City of Ferron.

Mr. William Wilson addressed the council and those in attendance. He had moved here 2 ½ years ago from Tampa Florida. In Florida he had served as a police officer and retired. **b. REPORT FROM ECSO - Tyson Huntington**

Sheriff Tyson Huntington addressed the Mayor and council and all those in attendance. He wanted to give a presentation or update on what the Emery County Sheriff Office has been doing. The Sheriff's office currently has 35 patrol officers, 7 certified correction officers, 5 certified dispatchers and 3 civilian staff. 5638 calls in Emery County, The majority are 911 hangups, 534 medicals, Explained different calls that they have had in the county. Traffic Stops 3300. Drug seizures meth 924, Cocaine . Law enforcement has changed a lot. Sherrif Huntington thanked the City of Ferron for all its support to the Sherriff office. Asked if there were any questions? Ferron City received a challenge coin.

**c. Jared Howes**

Reported on the most recent board meeting. May 19-23 EMT week. Update to MOU's. The new ambulance will be online in August. They did receive an EMT grant for stipends. Ferron was fully staffed 74% of the time in the month of March. That means there were 2 EMT's staffed. Anyone that wants to be an EMT, if we can get 6 individuals that are interested, and we can have a class. Mayor stated that he appreciates the EMS. If anyone is interested in taking the EMT class, please contact the city and we will contact Jared. The next EMT class will be basic. No one on the FD is an EMT. Council Member Brown felt that there should be fire fighters that are EMT trained. All fire were CPR trained but it has expired. Jared has been in contact with Fire Chief Randy Kenney to recertify the fire fighters.

**d. PRESENTATION OF AWARDS FOR ARBOR DAY CONTEST WINNERS – Council Member Ray Petersen**

Council Member Ray Petersen explained that it was cold and windy. He had wished for better attendance however he could understand why some had stayed home. There were 5 trees planted. He was very pleased with the participation in the poster contest. Ira Horton, Jane Henrie, Gabrielle Mills, Arena Morgan, Talyn Morgan were our winners and were presented with a certificate and a cash prize.

**e. FERRON CITY YOUTH COUNCIL – Report on Easter Celebration – Ethan Mills**

Ethan Mills thanks the local businesses. Multiple age groups for egg hunts. Rubber duck games, Easter Bunny. 9 teams participated in the Corn Hole tournament. Ashley Mills stated the kids did a great job.

**f. BLM TRAVEL PLAN – Wade Allison**

Mr. Allison thanked the City Council. The views that he will express are his own. He recognized the Pitchforths from Main Market and Brad Benson from Big Mountain. BLM has now come up with a plan that will close 949 inventory routes. There are 245 additional miles on the current plan that will close. The reason for all these closures is that there weren't archaeological surveys done. So, to avoid law suits it was agreed that the routes would just be shut down. Mr. Allison asks that the Mayor and Council support Alternative D. The city did not receive a BLM travel plan. The city was supposed to receive notice that they were closing BLM land around all 4 sides of Ferron city. ( Samples of the resolutions, letters that Emery County and Sevier County had written were give to the Council. ) The closure of these routes and campgrounds will effective not only residence here in Ferron but also tourism. A map was brought to Ferron City with all the areas that will be affected. The formal comment period opens June 1, 2024. If we comment prior the BLM is not required to respond. Mr. Allison strongly suggests that in our letter that we support ALT D. The letter is to be mailed to: BLM, 125 S 600 West 84501, RE: San Rafael Closure Plan. Business owners Clint and Hauvala Pitchforth explained how much tourism affects their business. It is suggested that the city also puts in their letter how important tourism is to our economy. Special interest groups are what is fueling this. It is being fast tracked. This is Washington DC not our local Price office. The city will be given a link that will help citizens also write a letter.

**g. DISCUSS/APPROVE/DENY Donation for Emery High Graduation Night – Tyler Fransen**

Asking for a donation of \$100- \$500 donation to help pay for the Emery High Graduation Night. They will be pooling together the money they have receive to have a graduation night to keep students off the streets and hopefully out of trouble.

**i. DISCUSS/APPROVE/DENY Purchase of New Playground Equipment for Fairgrounds**

**j. DISCUSS/APPROVE/DENY Fees for CC and ACH for City Charges**

Mayor advised that every time someone uses their credit card or pays with an electronic check the city is charged a fee. In the past the city has always just paid that fee. Last month we approved something similar for the golf course and now it is time that we look at something here at the city hall. Barbara Bowles advised that the city has already so far, this fiscal year has spent \$5,059.43 in fees for citizens to pay their water bills, businesses licenses, animals licenses basically anything that they need to pay the city for. She would like to suggest that City Hall charges the same amount of 4% for Credit Cards and 1.5 % for ACH. The City will not be making money from these fees but will be covering what they are charged. If approved, then a resolution will be written for the next city council meeting to have these fees added to the fee schedule.

**k. DISCUSS/APPROVE/DENY Lease Agreement with for Lawn Mowers for Golf Course**

Council Member Ray Petersen spoke about how he has seen the maintenance team at the golf course work on the machinery that they currently have and have done a great job keeping it going in the past. They had a mechanic/operator that was spending as much time maintaining the equipment as he was using the equipment. It is time to replace the mowers that the golf course has been using. He turned the time over to Kasey Edgehouse.

Kasey advised that the hard thing about getting equipment right now is everything is 18-24 months out. Ferron city is in need of 1-2 pieces of equipment where other golf courses are currently looking for 30 pieces which puts Ferron City as a low priority. He was able to find two pieces of equipment. One had 1000 hours and the other had 700 hours. There was a quote from Toro that was substantially lower, but those mowers have 4x the hours on them. Kasey felt that if they went with Toro they would be basically in the same position that they currently are in. Something that has that many hours on it and after 3 years of Millsite using it then it becomes something of a money pit. The equipment that is currently at the golf course, Kasey felt that if they could have put the money that they had put into these pieces towards a newer machine they would be better off. The past

mechanic/operator that they had spent 70% of his time working on equipment instead of working on the course. The golf course has come a long way in the last 2 years. Most of the play that is coming the Millsite is coming from out of area. "They" did a survey and for every \$1 spent at the golf course from out of area people, a \$1.25 is spent in the area. It was felt that Millsite helps the city by bringing in out-of-town players. They want to get a fairway mower right away. RMT is looking at getting Millsite some reels to use to get them by. Then in the next fiscal year they would like to purchase the greens mower. He felt that with these two pieces of equipment this will get them by. He also stated that luckily, they have had some other courses willing to come and mow for them, however with the season getting going that would not be an option for much longer. They are going to limit the fertilizer that they will be needing, they had enough from last year to do another application, the spring application. So, there is money in the fertilizer budget that he would like to move around so that they can at least get the one piece of equipment. Then in the next budget see what we can do to get the other piece of equipment.

The first mower wanted is the LF550 which is the fairway mower and then the hybrid eclipse mower. Kasey advised the council that they liked to do leases in 8-month increments. Make the payments while the course is open instead of the 12-month leases. He advised that is why there are 2 different quotes, one with 8-month payments and one with 12-month payments. Kasey then went on to advise the council that it was 18 months before John Deere could get them any equipment. Again, Toro has nothing in the 700-1000-hour range, all that is available is 3800 - 4500 hours.

Looking at the 3-year lease, \$1975 per month, for the LF550 fairway mower, it was asked when they would be able to deliver it and Kasey advised tomorrow. Kasey also advised that was the benefit of going through RMT. Kasey went on to say that Toro is easier to work with but they have absolutely nothing available in the category they are in. The question was asked: So, roughly you would need \$6,000 this fiscal year. Kasey believed that the lease would begin in May is two payments instead of three.

Mayor did state to Kasey that there was zero money in the budget for this. He asked Kasey about the money in the fertilizer budget. Kasey said that the money that was left in that budget would cover those payments. Council Member Brown asked again if they had enough fertilizer and Kasey stated that they just did the greens and that they would be good until the next fiscal year.

Mayor advised the council that there was money in the capital account that had been set aside for surveys that needed to be done for the purchase of land from the BLM. There are 2-3 studies that need to be done. That money could be used, however, that would set the city back on getting the studies done. Council Member Petersen said that he felt that they could leave the money in the capital account for the studies and find the money for the mowers in the current budget.

Council Member Brown asked about looking ahead. Where is the money going to come from for these mowers? Kasey stated that the course is breaking records. He sees it continuing. He will find the money with more tournaments and more passes. Kasey stated that he had been working with Barb to put money in different areas to make it workable for the next years. Council Member Brown asked if they were going to have to pull from the Capital Budget to get these mowers. Kasey stated no. The golf course has never been self-sustaining but is hoping to become.

Mayor Jackson pointed out to the council that there had been a payment of \$50,000 paid back to the utility fund from where the city had to loan the golf course money in the previous years. That is one of the reasons the expenses are really lean.

It was explained that the budget that was given to the council last year was very optimistic. It was explained to the council that the golf course is already max'd out on the fuel budget. Kasey was going to speak to the consultant about the advertising budget. Kasey stated that he had and that he had already spent the \$2500 and that if he could only spend another \$2,000. That extra money could be used to help with the other short falls in the budget.

The golf course had been down for 6 years with the building of the dam project. Working and trying to figure out what will be the new needs of the golf course as far as budget and where the money needs to be spent will be a learning curve.

It was explained that the Emery County travel bureau helps make the payment already for the golf course.

Next fiscal year the course will still have its last payment to the utility fund of \$40,000.

Kasey stated that if they can get the right equipment, the time and money that they have spent fixing the old equipment they can put into the course and it will continue to make money. Kasey doesn't want to keep spending money on old equipment.

Council Member Morgan asked about overhauling the mowers. Kasey stated that he didn't have any information about that. He would investigate it. Council Member Brown agreed about overhauling the mowers. Kasey advised that every golf course has a boneyard and if overhauling the mowers was possible then it would be done, but he would look into it. Mayor did state that when Marv was up at the course, he did try to fix what he could and would travel to find the parts that he needed. Mayor Jackson went on to state that ultimately it was himself and Barb that had to sign the audit. One of the things on the audit was that we had to keep the golf course in check and make sure that budget stays tight. That is one of the Mayors priorities. Mayor went on to state that if we are going to run a business, we must have the means to run it. Mayor does want Kasey to investigate what it would cost to have an old mower overhauled. Kasey advised that he does sharpen the reels and gets parts from R & R to try to fix the mowers. Kasey feels that once you start looking at what you put into the parts and labor it might not be worth it.

The question was asked if Kasey is settling for a mower that he really didn't want. Kasey really wants a Toro mower. Would it be worth fixing what we got and waiting for a Toro? Council Member Morgan asked if the leased mower that came from RMT came with some kind of warranty? Kasey couldn't answer those questions but will check into and get an answer. Kasey feels

that we should be good. It was stated that you must spend money to make money. Council Member Brown stated that they aren't saying that they don't need new mowers. However, they are looking at the best way to spend the city's money. The question was asked why they don't raise the fee to golf to pay for this stuff? Kasey stated that in the last 3 years they have gone from being dirt to having a course. The fees will continually increase. The price will increase when the spillway spills. The mowers will be stored in the maintenance shop. Member Brown asked the price difference between leasing to own and buying it right out. The mowers will get 600-700 hours for the fairway and the other 400-500.

Kasey would like the LF550 now instead of waiting for the new mowers. He doesn't want to wait and keeps putting money into older mowers.

**Council Member Brown motioned to approve the lease agreement for the LF550 at 3 years for 8 months per year at \$1957.54 per month. Council Member Ray Petersen seconded the motion.**
