

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING AND PROPOSED ANNEXATION  
UTAH TRANSIT AUTHORITY  
BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

RE: A PUBLIC HEARING IS BEING HELD REGARDING THE PROPOSED ANNEXATION OF MORGAN COUNTY INTO THE UTAH TRANSIT AUTHORITY

- I. It is proposed that Morgan County be annexed into the transit district of the Utah Transit Authority for the purpose of receiving limited transit services to the County.
- II. The public hearing will be held on Wednesday, July 30, from 6:00 – 7:45 PM at the Morgan County Building Auditorium, located at 48 West Young Street, Morgan, Utah 84050, Morgan County.
- III. At the hearing, the Utah Transit Authority Board of Trustees will afford an opportunity for the public to ask questions and obtain further information about the proposed annexation and issues raised by it and allow any interested person to address the Board of Trustees regarding the proposed annexation.
- IV. To assure full participation at this hearing, accommodations for effective communication, such as sign language interpreters or printed materials in alternate formats, must be requested at least five (5) working days prior to the date of the scheduled event. Direct requests for accommodations to the Utah Transit Authority, ADA Compliance Officer at (801) 287-3536 or for deaf/hearing impaired persons, dial 711 to make a relay call.
- V. Written comments may be submitted to the following address: c/o Rebecca Cruz, 669 West 200 South, Salt Lake City, UT 84101. All comments will become part of the public hearing record if received by August 1, 2014.
- VI. Relevant information about the proposed annexations will be available at the public hearing. In addition, information about the proposed annexation is available by calling (801) 262-5626 or may be reviewed at the UTA Corporate offices, located at 669 West 200 South, Salt Lake City, Utah 84101.
- VII. If the proposed annexation is completed the estimated financial impact to residents would be an additional \$0.0025 sales and use tax imposed on all taxable transactions within Morgan County. \$21.33 per person or approximately \$72.11 per family per year for the residents of the County. This estimate is based on an anticipated revenue of \$201,900 per year.
  1. Property owners and registered voters within Morgan County may protest the annexation by filing a written protest with the Utah Transit Authority Board of Trustees within 30 days after the public hearing.
