i. Discussion

A discussion ensued about the new higher data requirements listed in the new bill. There were some concerns about the burden that puts on LHC's and providers. There were some members who expressed their appreciation for the support from the Office of Homeless Services thus far. OHS has committed to continue to help and support LHC's where possible. The OHS data team is also going to be focusing on data integration to try and reduce the multiple reporting systems required to use. Realizing the costs of this data, and advocating to fill the needs it may create were determined important things to note moving forward with the new Utah Homeless Services Board.
