He answered some specific questions regarding Big Cottonwood Creek and Jordan River. Chief Boulden explained safeguards in place regarding flooding concerns of Big Cottonwood Creek that runs through both Wheeler Farm and Murray City Park.

Scott will be checking with Murray City Mayor's office regarding the protocol for posting Advisory Board Meetings and Minutes on the discussed media sites.

3. Chief Matt Boulden - 3 Year EMS & Fire Response by City Fire Departments

Chief Boulden presented a portion of a visual presentation he made to the Murray City Council Meeting. The presentation identified data collected over a three-year period regarding the fire department responses to the community calls. The presentation included responses in support of other local fire department agencies. There has been an increase in calls as the population has increased.
