Mayor Jed Maxwell called the regular City Council meeting to order 7:00 pm. at the Salina City Hall led the pledge of allegiance **Jon Maxwell** offered the opening prayer.

Visitors: Jori Kloosterman- Drug & Tabaco compliance: Jori Kloosterman approached Salina City Council on behalf of the Health Department requesting legislation for drug and tobacco free city. Kloosterman stated e-cigarettes and vaping are becoming more common, especially among the youth, which can cause proper brain development, this is a public health concern. Kloosterman mentioned the Blackhawk Arena presents a challenge tobacco-wise as for banning the use within the city limits. She urged banning the substances city-wide except at the Blackhawk Arena. Mayor Maxwell mentioned his concerns of the Utah Clean Air Act which has already banned smoking inside buildings and within a certain space from the businesses. Taking tobacco from the cowboys at the Blackhawk Arena could be problematic. Allen Tietjen suggested providing education rather than legislation, and asked if tobacco prevention education is readily available to youth. He is 100% onboard teaching the youth. Mayor Maxwell encouraged Kloosterman to reach out to Salina City Resource Officer Greg Harwood and work with him on providing educational opportunities related to the subject. The council thanked Ms. Kloosterman for attending Salina City Council.

Jeff Stithem-Veterans Memorial: Stithem Salina's American Legion Post Commander, thanked Mayor Maxwell and Council for their support in funding flags for all veterans buried in the Salina City cemeteries. The volunteers will be posting the flags the Thursday prior to Memorial Day and encourage anyone to come participate with them.

Discuss school zone, 3-way stop with lighted signs Police Chief Al Taylor addressed his concerns of the many "near misses" of students on the road in front of the Salina Elementary School. Increasing incidents continue to happen. An incident happened last week of a driver texting and driving who missed hitting a young student by inches. Sevier School District has not only increased vigilance at the cross walks, but also now has parent volunteers to help young people cross the streets during busy times. The district asked Salina City to get some signs with flashing lights and turn the intersection of 300 North and 200 West into a 3-way stop. Chief Taylor stated Sevier School District is not willing to help pay for the flashing stop signs, as it is a city street and therefore Salina City's responsibility. Chief Taylor will receive the cost of the flashing signs and present it to Mayor Maxwell and Council. Mayor Maxell and Council agreed it was an issue and something that needs to be addressed as soon as possible. "If it saves the life of one kid, it will be money well spent." Said Jon Maxwell. It was decided for Chief Taylor to order the flashing lights and Salina City Maintenance will install them.

Chief Taylor also voiced his concerns of many curbs in town that need to be repainted red.
