

Summary of Changes

The Food Service Sanitation Regulation was first adopted by the Davis County Board of Health in 1979. This regulation established standards for providing food that is safe, unadulterated, and honestly presented in Davis County. The regulation was last updated in 2022. However, at that time the primary focus of the revision was to implement changes deemed necessary by new legislation. The fees have not been updated since 2018 and so changes to the regulation this year are primarily driven by the re-assessment of fees, including those for Mobile Food Businesses that are required to be uniform statewide. After completing this review, the Department has proposed the following changes:

- Updating the name of Utah Administrative Code R392-102 from Food Truck Sanitation to Mobile Food Business Sanitation.
- Adding language to specify that a food establishment permit is required if you advertise offering food for public consumption.
- Revising the renewal language to require payment 30 days prior to operating each year rather than 30 days prior to expiration so that this regulation also applies to food operations that only operate seasonally.
- Removing the Limited-Use Food Establishment permit and associated requirements.
 - This was primarily used to permit food carts. They are now included as Mobile Food Businesses.
- Specifying requirements for commissaries.
- Updating the fee schedule, including adding fees to review a HACCP plan, conduct a Residential Care inspection, and combining the plan review fee for Temporary Food Establishments into the permit fee.
